

You May Qualify for a Tax Deduction for Tuition

Do you qualify for an Education Expense Deduction? If you have a dependent child enrolled in K-12 private school or who is home-schooled, you may qualify for a deduction based on education expenditures for that child. Expenditures include tuition, fees, textbooks, and school supplies. If you are eligible, this deduction is \$1,000 per qualified dependent.
