

LIVE THE LITURGY

Inspiration for the week

The fruits of our labors are not always seen in our lifetimes. Faith is not conditional on seeing results. Faith is a radical trust in what is unseen. It requires vigilance and self-investment. It requires our attention even when our efforts don't bear fruit or are unappreciated or unrecognized. A person who is open to accepting God's presence, however it comes, and is willing to share the love received with others is a true inspiration. Good works will flow from this vigilant depth of faith. It will be directed where it is most needed and detached from the need for recognition or gratitude. Faith exercised in secret is the most profound expression of faith and a testament of true love for our Creator. No one needs to know the humility, generosity, and goodness of our hearts, only God. Standing erect and watchful, we are prepared to receive the gift of Divine Love and freely share it with others, without recognition or self-benefit.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saint Jane Frances de Chantal was born to a noble family in Dijon, France, on January 28, 1572. Her mother died when she was an infant. Her father raised her and provided for her education. In 1592 She married the Baron de Chantal, the couple were devoted to each other. They had six children, three of whom died in infancy. As Baroness, Saint Jane Frances restored the custom of daily Mass, and was famous for her charitable works. Unfortunately, her husband died in a hunting accident only eight years after their marriage. Devastated Jane Frances was forced to live in her father-in-law's strict household where she took a vow of chastity.

In 1604 while visiting her father in Dijon, she met Saint Francis de Sales and he became her close friend and spiritual director. Although not many of their epistles have survived, the pair had a lively correspondence which lasted until Saint Francis died.

Under the direction of St. Francis de Sales and with his partnership she established the Congregation of the Visitation at Annecy in 1610. This was a unique order, without the extreme ascetical practices typical in other religious orders, accepting women and girls and those rejected by other orders because of poor health or age. The new order was also unusual in its public ministry, rather than a strictly cloistered life. Saint Jane transformed her convent at Annecy into a hospital during the plague of 1628.

The saint died at the Visitation Convent in Moulins on December 13, 1641. At the time of her death, there were 86 convents of Visitation nuns. She was canonized in 1767 by Pope Clement XIII.

Consecrated Host Fragment at Mass

The priest breaks off a small part of the consecrated Host during the Agnus Dei, which is after the Lord's Prayer and the sign of peace, but before holy Communion. The rubrics specify: "Then he takes the Host, breaks it over the paten, and places a small piece in the chalice, saying quietly: 'May this mingling of the Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ bring eternal life to us who receive it." The celebrant breaks the bread because that is what Jesus did at the Last Supper, and on that very night Jesus said, "Do this in memory of me." Furthermore, the priest drops that little piece of the consecrated Host into the chalice with the Precious Blood to signify the unity of the Church. As

the General Instruction of the Roman Missal explains: "The gesture of breaking bread done by Christ at the Last Supper, which in apostolic times gave the entire Eucharistic Action its name, signifies that the many faithful are made one body (1 Cor 10:17) by receiving Communion from the one Bread of Life, which is Christ, who for the salvation of the world died and rose again" (No. 83).

Feast of the Assumption of Mary, Mother of God

The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is not a Holy Day of Obligation in 2022. This year it falls on Monday, August 15.

Whenever January 1, August 15, or November 1 falls on a Saturday or on a Monday, the precept to attend Mass is abrogated meaning the Solemnity is **not** a Holy Day of Obligation.



Linen Ministry

The Linen Ministry has the responsibility of maintaining the linens used during Mass. It is a responsibility that is very flexible. The linens are laundered and ironed once a week. They are picked up in the sacristy on Mondays and returned by Friday. Each person takes a month at a time, two to three times a year. Scheduling is flexible and done for your convenience. Receiving Holy Communion in the Hand




IMPORTANT

As a sign of respect for Our Lord, YOU SHOULD NEVER RECEIVE THE HOST WITH ONE HAND. If a disability prevents you from receiving with both hands, you should receive the Sacrament on the tongue.
