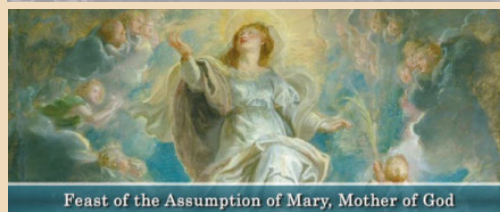

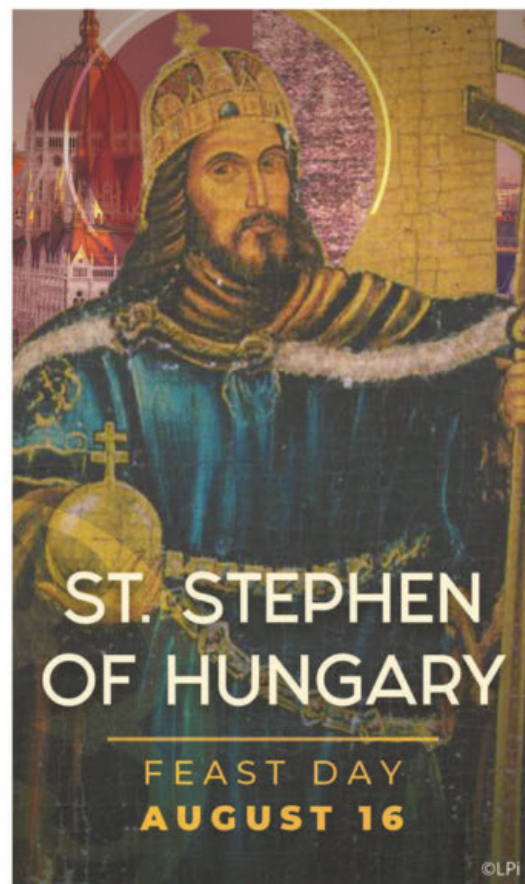

## LIVE THE LITURGY

### Inspiration for the week

There is a "great cloud of witnesses" found in the official saints of the church and in ordinary people we meet every day. They are faith-filled inspirations who, by their example, help us to persevere in our faith. Living in a sea of conflict, change, challenge, and confusion, it is easy to grow tired and get weary. With so many things in competition for our attention, it is challenging to keep our eyes fixed on Jesus and the Kingdom of God. We have to keep running the race and continue proclaiming the Good News. This message is not always welcome. It can cause division, challenge accepted mindsets, ruffle peoples' feathers, and cause some folks to become defensive. God's ways are not always our ways. Even though often rejected by the world, the message of God in Jesus Christ must continue to be preached. We can rely on the examples of faith before us and around us and not lose heart. As Jesus endured the voices of opposition, so too can we.



## SAINT OF THE WEEK

Born a pagan in the 10th century Saint Stephen was baptized as a boy when his father converted to Christianity. Saint Stephen married Gisela, daughter of Duke Henry II of Bavaria who would become Saint Henry II. He succeeded his father as leader and began to transform the nation into a Christian kingdom.

Pope Sylvester II proclaimed him the first king of Hungary in 1001, sending him a crown and gold processional cross. The crown, made in the Byzantine style, has become a symbol of Hungarian nationhood.

King Stephen's reign was a relatively peaceful and prosperous time. He outlawed paganism, mandated church building, and tithing for support of the parish, and commanded all to marry except clergy and religious. He founded a Benedictine monastery, and Hungary became an important place along the route to the Holy Land for many pilgrims.

Unfortunately, Stephen's son and heir died in a hunting accident, causing much conflict over the succession when the saint died. Eventually the kingdom was won back for Christendom and father and son were canonized in 1083 by Pope St. Gregory VII. Saint Stephen I is now patron saint of Hungary.

### *Sponsor Guidelines and Expectations of the Sponsor*

#### **Sponsor Guidelines**

Must be a confirmed, practicing Catholic who attends Sunday and Holy Day masses regularly and participates in the Sacramental life of the Church.

Must be sufficiently mature to fulfill their function as a sponsor (encourage minimum age is 18)

Sponsor may be male or female

Married sponsors must be in a valid Catholic marriage.

Must be a person who is an example and a witness of the Catholic faith in word and action.

Must be friendly, trustworthy, and a good listener.

Must be one who will attend liturgical celebrations, meetings, rehearsals, and Easter Vigil where the candidate will receive their Initiation Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation & Eucharist.

Only one sponsor is required and cannot be a parent or spouse of the candidate.

#### **Expectations of the Sponsor**

Attend Mass & classes with the candidate as needed.

Participate in retreat day, rehearsals & Rites as required with the candidate.

Meet regularly to encourage and assist the candidate to grow in knowledge, prayer, service, and worship.

Participate in other parish activities required of the process.

### *Receiving Holy Communion in the Hand*



#### **IMPORTANT**

When receiving Holy Communion in the hand YOU MUST CONSUME THE HOST IMMEDIATELY, before you turn away from the minister.

It is NOT acceptable to walk away and then consume.

As a sign of respect for Our Lord, YOU SHOULD NEVER RECEIVE THE HOST WITH ONE HAND. If a disability prevents you from receiving with both hands, you should receive the Sacrament on the tongue.

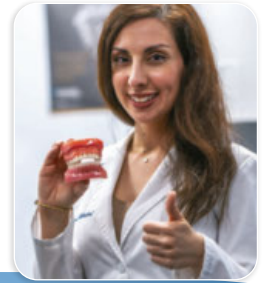

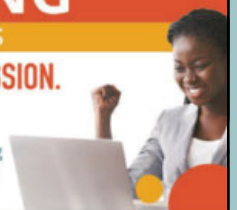

## LOVE INCARNATE

... waiting for you

*Ten Biblical Reasons for Wanting To  
Spend One Hour with Jesus in The Blessed Sacrament*



### 1. He is really there!

"I myself am the living bread come down from heaven." (Jn 6:35)

### 2. Day and night Jesus dwells in the Blessed Sacrament because of his Infinite love for you!

"Behold I will be with you always even to the end of the world," because "I have loved you with an everlasting love, and constant is my affection for you." (Mt 28:20; Jer 31:3)

### 3. The specific way that Jesus asks you to love him in return is to spend one quiet hour with him in the Blessed Sacrament.

"Where your treasure is, there is your heart...." "Could you not watch one hour with me?" (Mt 6:21; 26:40)

### 4. When you look upon the Sacred Host, you look upon Jesus, the Son of God.

"Indeed, this is the will of my Father, that everyone who looks upon the Son and believes in him shall have eternal life. Him I will raise up on the last day." (Jn 6:40)

### 5. Each moment that you spend in His Eucharistic Presence will increase his divine life within you and deepen your personal relationship and friendship with him.

"I have come that you may have life and have it more abundantly." "I am the vine, and you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him shall bear much fruit because without me, you can do nothing." (Jn 15:5)

### 6. Each hour you spend with Jesus will deepen his divine peace in your heart.

"Come to me all of you who are weary and find life burdensome and I will refresh you..." "Cast all of you anxieties upon the one who cares for you..." "My Peace is My Gift to you." (Mt 11:28; Pt 5:7; Jn 14:17)

### 7. Jesus will give you all the graces you need to be happy! "The Lamb on the throne will shepherd them. He will lead them to the springs of life-giving water." (Rev 7:17)

### 8. Jesus is infinitely deserving of our unceasing thanksgiving and adoration for all he has done for our salvation.
