It is important that I bring to your attention and I ask that you also bring the matter to your family members and fellow parishioners, that we are in desperate need for each parish family to help with the expenses of our faith community. We have not been receiving the level of tithing that can sustain the expenses of our parish community. So often, folks tend to think with all the expenses they have in their household along with the extras they want to have that somehow someone else will be responsible for the expenses of their faith community. Another mindset that tends to be present is that of a consumer, that I will just pay for the service that I use at church. When I go, then if I have something, I will put something in the collection or, if I need to rent the hall, then as a parishioner, I expect to have a big discount. Yet, the very point in order for us to have such a place to worship and receive the sacraments and place to celebrate various occasions is that it takes the financial help of all its members to keep the doors open not only in the present, but we fulfill our obligations for future generations as others

have done for us. A tithe is a command of God that we give back to God as a sign of gratitude for all God has provided us. It is important that we do not approach the Church, its members, Father, with a mindset of “What can you do for me?” The attitude of a beloved daughter/son of the Father should be, “What can I do to help the family?” So often we allow pettiness to interfere with the tithe that God commands of us. We end up basically not fulfilling God’s command and teaching concerning the tithe, but we use the tithe as a way to vote whether they like what is happening in our community or not. Sometimes people approach the Church and say, “You know I tithe here, but if you do not do such and such, then I won’t give anymore or I will go elsewhere.” Here is the problem: it is one thing if one member out of the whole community does that, but it is quite another when every member thinks this way. I believe God is saying that is how evil causes division in the family because of “can you make me happy and feel good and cater to my wishes? If not, then I will go elsewhere.” How about “What is God asking of us so that we can be united as a

family?” This means we need to instruct and correct misunderstandings and we also need to remind one another that “I am doing my part for the community how about you?” As you consistently see in the yearly reporting, less than one-third of the parish gives something during the year and even far less than that do so on a regular basis. I bring this matter to your attention for your reflection because, many times, we rarely think about our responsibility to the community when you, the community, took care of our needs. Now we are the ones to be more responsible and - whether we like something or not - the tithe is never to be used to vote whether you like someone or not or some kind of direction or not. When there is a project over and above the ongoing expenses of the church, then you can decide whether you support that or not, but not the tithe. It is an expression of our gratitude to God and we offer back from all that we have received as a sign of our giving God thanks - “with no strings attached”.

If you measure success by money, children, or other common goals to a secular life, then in your eyes, your son will not be successful.


