This week's first reading and Gospel seem a bit harsh at first glance. They both suggest that to a degree, we are responsible, for, or at least contribute to, the actions of others. That's kind of scary. The thought that we could be held accountable for warning others of their wrongdoing, and have some level of input toward the result of that warning is rather overwhelming.

The Gospel even suggests that we may need to take a small crowd of witnesses when confronting someone who has wronged us. Sounds a bit like vigilante action. I'm sure we have all told someone, more or less, "I know what you did, and you're going to get it!" Or we rounded up support when we were upset with someone. But the messages of Ezekiel and Matthew are

somewhat sterner. The challenge here is in the approach. St. Paul ties it all together by commanding us to love one another. A loving touch, a gentle tone, a softened blow will usually be better received - and more effective - than "strongarming" someone. One day at a time, live fully and gently.
