The 4th Sunday of Advent and Christmas Eve fall on the same day, and that creates a bit of confusion for some folks. I have been asked if attending Mass in the evening for Christmas Eve fulfills the Sunday obligation. Unfortunately, it does not. One still must fulfill the Holy Day of Obligation when it comes to Sundays and other designated days throughout the calendar year. What I would recommend is attending Saturday evening for the Sunday obligation and then Sunday evening for the Christmas obligation, or Monday morning whichever is convenient.

We have singing and music planned before the Christmas Eve Mass so please come early.

With Christmas already upon us, some might feel a bit frazzled or tired due to last mi-

nute preparations and gift buying. Might I suggest we bring ourselves and our significant others to a calm and focus on this special Solemnity.

I remember, in my younger years, cleaning the house and setting out numerous candles, eventually lowering the lighting, and Christmas music playing in the background for a sacred ambience. It truly set the tone when it came to the specialness of the Christmas Eve Day. The young need impressionable moments like a special ambience in the home to draw their minds to something other than themselves or their phones or tablets. Homes are an extension of God's house where it is a place of community, reverence, quiet, and the sacred. Our homes are a sanctuary where we pray, read God's word as well as ask God's blessings for the vari-
