

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This Sunday's Gospel reading comes from Jesus's discourse at the Last Supper in the Gospel of John. Jesus reminds his disciples that his words are not to burden them with excess worries or tasks, but instead are intended for the fullness of their lives and joy. We are all called 'to go and bear fruit that will remain." This means that we are called to use our baptismal call to bring the good news of Jesus's life, death and resurrection to our fellow brothers and sisters in order for them to have a closer relationship with God through Jesus Christ.

Next, there is an ongoing need for food items in our greater community. We are asking everyone to bring in donated food items on a regular basis for the St. Vincent De Paul food pantry. The SVD food pantry is always in need of nutritious nonperishable food items. Thank you for your great generosity.

Next, we are currently providing livestreaming of the Masses here at St. Hyacinth. Please go to our website, Sthyacinth.org, St. Hyacinth Facebook page or St. Hyacinth Viemo.com page to view the current livestream mass. The Livestream Mass can be seen through our website page. Be on the lookout for the Sunday, 10:00 am, livestream mass if you are not able to come to Mass. We are looking for individuals who would like to help St. Hyacinth expand its video ministry program. One of our parish goals in 2021 is to increase the number of families supporting St Hyacinth using Faith Direct. Currently we have 213 families using Faith Direct and hopefully by the end of the year we can have at least 325 families of STHY on Faith Direct. The number of 325 families represents 20% of our parish population of registered parishioners. You can register in less than five minutes by logging onto sthyacinth.org and pressing the Faith Direct icon *and* entering our parish code of TX526 or by just simply scanning the QR code found on the poster in the Narthex.

However, I do want to address the approximately over 1044 registered families here at STHY that we have no record of your giving to the Church. We do acknowledge that many are giving to the Church through the weekend collection; however, STHY needs you start moving toward electronic giving. In this way we can account for all those who are a part of the parish that are truly giving and it is an expense of the church for envelopes to be mailed to registered families. We currently spend close to \$10K a year on offertory envelopes and if we could use our electronic giving, this would reduce the expense of mailed offertory envelopes dramatically.

The first phase of the Church renovation will be starting in a next few weeks with the replacement of both the heating and cooling systems for the Church and Church complex. The heating system has already failed and is no longer working and the HVAC system is currently failing and needs to be replaced due to its age. This will be a major undertaking to replace our aged systems of the parish. The heating and HVAC systems of the Church are interconnected with the Religious Education building; soo the work will be extensive.

Furthermore, we have signed a contract with Studio Red Architects who will help guide us on phase two of the renovation of the Church. Studio Red Architects have provided their services to several of our parishes here in the Archdiocese, and I am confident they will be able to lead us in the renovation of our fifty plus year old church. Thank you for your generosity to St. Hyacinth.

Next, please pray for the young people of our parish. We will have several first communion Masses in the Month of May along with the Confirmation Mass on May 25th.

Finally, on behalf of everyone here at St. Hyacinth We want to wish all Mothers of our parish a happy and Blessed Mother's Day.

God Bless, Fr. Reginald Samuels The celebration of the sacraments, with a congregation, has now resumed. We have resumed the regular scheduled weekday and weekend Mass times in keeping with the directives issued by Cardinal DiNardo, an in accordance with national, state and local mandates, St. Hyacinth has resumed liturgical celebrations in the following manner:

- Dispensation from Sunday obligation to attend in person is extended until further notice, especially with respect to people who may be considered physically well to attend yet believe it best to stay at home.
- The at-risk populations are encouraged to continue participating by tuning in to the livestreamed Mass on our parish website **Sthyacinth.org**, from their homes and avoid attending Mass in person. At-risk population is defined as those who are 65 years or older, those with chronic lung disease; moderate to severe asthma; chronic heart disease; severe obesity; diabetes; chronic kidney disease undergoing dialysis; or weakened immune systems.
- Parishioners are asked to take their temperatures before coming to Mass and should not attend, if exhibiting any signs of illness or an elevated body temperature.
- In order to accommodate social distancing protocols, and to abide by Phase One state regulations, no more than 50% of the mandated fire code seating capacity of the building is allowed. Therefore, each Mass at St. Hyacinth will be limited to no more than 200 people.
- Church doors will be open for 15 minutes before Mass is to begin. Church doors will open Saturday 4:45 pm, Sunday 7:45 am, 9:45 am and 11:45 am. Please stay in your cars until the doors are open for the Church.
- The Church Narthex will serve as the ONLY entrance to the Church. Enter Narthex doors from either the Center Street parking lot or the P street parking lot.
- Parishioners are required to wear masks, upon entering the church and throughout the celebration of the Mass.
- For the safety of all, the Holy Water fonts and Holy Water tank will remain empty, the exchange of the Sign of Peace, the distribution of the Precious Blood and the offertory procession will be omitted and missalettes and hymnals will not be available.
- Parishioners should be careful not to gather too closely when entering or leaving the church.
- Hand sanitizers will be available and easily visible at the church entrances.
- Social distancing will be practiced and enforced.
- Parishioners will be seated in every other pew.
- Those of the same household can be seated in the same pew.
- Priests and Deacons will wear masks during the distribution of Holy Communion.
- The congregation will remain in their pews for the distribution of Holy Communion, which prevents the formation of a Communion line.
- For health and safety reasons, parishioners are asked to receive Holy Communion in the hand.
- The church will be closed for sanitation between Masses. Pews and bathrooms will be sanitized thoroughly between Masses.

I have called you friends,


because I have told you everything I have heard from my Father.


