Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In as little as less than two months we will celebrate the First Sunday of Advent. As we approach the feast of Christ the King and the end of the liturgical year, our readings turn to the parables and preach of Jesus' final week in Jerusalem before his crucifixion. Jesus is basically preparing himself, his disciples and we Christians to what lies ahead, and His words take on a sense of urgency and intensity as each parable is presented.

The gospel this weekend is a parable that Jesus told to the chief priests and elders of the people. The parable is about a landowner who planted a vineyard and rented it to some tenants, but they refused to give him the fruits of the vineyard and killed his servants and his son. The parable reveals the hiding meaning of God's relationship with Israel and his sending of the prophets and Jesus.

The parable goes on further and warns that God will take away the kingdom of God from those who reject him and give it to those who produce fruits of righteousness. We are all called to make sure that our lives are fruitful and a blessing to the people in Church and community.

One of the principal goals of 2023 is to increase the number of people that are contributing to the Church through our electronic giving platform. We have over 1000 registered families here at STHY that maybe giving to our parish in the Sunday collection; however, we don't have a record of them using their envelopes or electronic giving. You can enroll for online giving through <https://www.sthyacinth.org/online-giving>

In celebration of our parish 58th anniversary, this year's parish project, the entire community of St. Hyacinth is being asked to provide support for the renovation and restoration of the two main stain glass windows of the Church. To support this project, please go to <https://sthyacinth.org/stain-glass-renovation-project> to donate. We hope to raise \$75,000 for the renovation and restoration of our Holy Spirit Window and Christ the Good Shepherd window. Thank you for your generosity.

For 2023, Cardinal DiNardo has assessed our parish DSF goal at \$85,000. As of the writing for this bulletin we have collected \$49,776. Go to: <https://www.archgh.org/ways-to-give/diocesan-services-fund-dsf/donate-to-dsf/> and give to DSF 2023. Thank you for your generosity.

Finally, as you know by now, the bishops of the United States are charging the faithful to celebrate a National Eucharistic Revival. This is a three-year initiative launched in 2022 on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, or Corpus Christi. This renewal began at the diocesan level, inviting diocesan staff, bishops, and priests to what Pope Francis has described as "a renewed personal encounter with Jesus Christ"—particularly the transforming power and mercy of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist.

As we enter the second year of the National Eucharistic revival, the of archdiocese Parish level Revival began on June 11, 2023—also on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. The year has been marked by historic initiatives, such as the first-ever National Eucharistic Pilgrimage.

On July 17, 2024, the faithful of the United States will gather for the first time in 83 years for a National Eucharistic Congress. This historic moment will launch the United States into a Year of Mission, sending on-fire Catholics out to share Christ's love "for the life of the world." Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

On July 1, 2023, we began a new fiscal year at STHY as did all of the parishes in the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston. One of the chief responsibilities of a pastor is sound management of the Church's temporal goods and prudent and balanced management of all financial responsibilities. Copies of the FY 2022-2023 financial report are in the narthex and or online at Sthyacinth.org.

I can report that St. Hyacinth's financial health is stable at best. However, going forward we are and are currently challenged in the parish finances.

The good news is that Church bills are being paid; we are in good standing with all our Archdiocesan obligations and St. Hyacinth has NO DEBT. However, STHY's finances going forward in 2024 will be challenged by the dramatic increase in the cost of ministry obligations, inflation, and the dramatic increase in the cost of maintaining the aging infrastructures of the parish facilities.

Currently, St Hyacinth is not meeting our weekly planned budget contribution goals of \$16,233.08. (The weekly financial budget goals are listed in the bulletin and online every week). The planned budget contribution amount is the year (FY2024) budget amount broken down to a weekly amount. (52 weeks).

The projected FY 2024 budget has been discerned to be drastically conservative in nature, with forecasted collections and revenue to remain flat. **Due to the challenges, we face here at St. Hyacinth in the coming year, the budget cannot account for all of the major increase in the costs and expenses for ministry and to take care of our 55-year-old Church building, 39-year-old Guyot Hall building and Rectory. All the infrastructures are aging and are in need of major attention and repairs constantly.**

Currently, we are raising \$75,000 for the restoration of our stain glass windows. Hopefully, this will allow us to address an important need of our Church's continued future. However, we are continuing to repair, replace and refurbish the Church building and complex structures. The Church, education building, Guyot Hall and Rectory, all have been repainted with a new color scheme which will be reflected in the rebuilt education and office building.

I pray that your continued giving will exceed our forecast. As our parish and ministries continue to do the work commissioned by Christ, we must all continue to be good stewards of God's gifts so we can effectively serve those who seek to encounter Christ at STHY.

Yet, I want to thank each of you for your continued sacrifice, week in and week out, to support the ministries and operations of our parish. Only with your support are we able to do the work of the Gospel. Thank you very much.

I ask that you prayerfully consider reviewing your weekly giving to the parish, and if it has remained at a constant and consistent level the past few years, please consider increasing it.

However, I do want to address the approximately **the over 1000 registered families here at STHY that we have no record of your giving to the Church.** We do acknowledge that many are giving to the Church through the weekend collection; however, STHY needs you to start using your envelopes or move toward electronic giving. In this way we can account for all those who are a part of the parish that are truly giving, and it is an expense of the church for envelopes to be mailed to registered families. **We currently spend close to \$10K a year on offertory envelopes and if we could use our electronic giving, this would reduce the expense of mailed offertory envelopes dramatically.**

Everyone's gift of a weekly tithe in the offertory is a great act of Stewardship. And remember, you can do it in two ways, through your parish envelopes that are mailed to you or electronically through online giving.
