

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Church Tradition lets us know that the third Sunday of Advent is "Gaudete," "Rejoice," Sunday, named after the entrance antiphon in the Roman Missal. At the midpoint of our season, the liturgy overflows with rejoicing. This season is meant to show the joy of our faith in Christ the Light. The season of Advent encourages us to make time in our preparations to joyfully greet Jesus in the Christmas season.

The Advent candle for the 3rd Sunday of Advent symbolizes Joy with the "Shepherd's Candle" reminding us of the Joy the world experienced at the coming birth of Jesus.

Like John the Baptist, we all play a role in revealing and announcing Jesus Christ to the world. Just as the prophet Isaiah announces a year of the lord, we are called to use the action of announcing all the ways in which God has been there for us. We are all called to reach out to those that are less fortunate, to make sure that the good news of Jesus is heard and seen in the world.

Now that the Holiday season is in full swing and there are several opportunities for our parish community to witness the love of Christ to those in need this season. The 6-inch metal structural walls for the building are about 90% complete. The trusses installation and sheathing are underway. This process should take a few weeks.




