Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The work of discernment, learning to listen to God, is a process that we all grow into. With practice, we become more and more familiar with the ways of God and how He works in our lives. We learn to hear and see God at work in the people in our lives as well. As we approach this week's gospel, we are called to recognize the voice of God calling in our lives.

"Behold the Lamb of God" is the gospel passage that John the Baptist begins Sunday's passage. We know these words very well because they are a part of the Eucharistic celebration. As we enter the season of Ordinary time, we are called to delve deeper into our own relationship with the Lamb of God. As we witness the closeness of Jesus's disciples, we are called to be close to Him as well.

Next, I want to thank all those who have contributed to the various donation drives that have been going on here at STHY over the Christmas season. For our Stain Glass restoration project, we have collected \$51,643 soo far. Thank you for your generosity in helping us reach our goal. This action is extremely distracting for the Readers of the Mass, the Cantor performing the Psalm response and the rest of the Church congregation that are seated. We understand that there all kinds of circumstances and reasons for someone to be late for Mass, however, it is extremely distracting for someone to enter the Church during the readings and the singing of the psalm response. Once the readings and the singing of Psalm response are over, we will give everyone chance to be seated before the Priest or Deacon gives the homily. Thank you for your cooperation with this matter.

The Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading 1

1 Sm 3:3b-10, 19

Samuel was sleeping in the temple of the LORD where the ark of God was.

The LORD called to Samuel, who answered, "Here I am."

Samuel ran to Eli and said, "Here I am. You called me."

"I did not call you, " Eli said. "Go back to sleep." So he went back to sleep.

Again the LORD called Samuel, who rose and went to Eli.

"Here I am, " he said. "You called me."

But Eli answered, "I did not call you, my son. Go back to sleep."

At that time Samuel was not familiar with the LORD,

because the LORD had not revealed anything to him as yet.

The LORD called Samuel again, for the third time. Getting up and going to Eli, he said, "Here I am. You called me."

Then Eli understood that the LORD was calling the youth.

So he said to Samuel, "Go to sleep, and if you are called, reply,

Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening." When Samuel went to sleep in his place, the LORD came and revealed his presence, calling out as before, "Samuel, Samuel!" Samuel answered, "Speak, for your servant is listening."

Samuel grew up, and the LORD was with him, not permitting any word of his to be without effect.
