Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The work of discernment, learning to listen to God, is a process that we all grow into. With practice, we become more and more familiar with the ways of God and how He works in our lives. We learn to hear and see God at work in the people in our lives as well. As we approach this week's gospel, we are called to recognize the voice of God calling in our lives.

"Behold the Lamb of God" is the gospel passage that John the Baptist begins Sunday's passage. We know these words very well because they are a part of the Eucharistic celebration. As we enter the season of Ordinary time, we are called to delve deeper into our own relationship with the Lamb of God. As we witness the closeness of Jesus's disciples, we are called to be close to Him as well.

Next, I want to thank all those who have contributed to the various donation drives that have been going on here at STHY over the Christmas season. For our Stain Glass restoration project, we have collected \$51,643 so far. Thank you for your generosity in helping us reach our goal. This action is extremely distracting for the Readers of the Mass, the Cantor performing the Psalm response and the rest of the Church congregation that are seated. We understand that there all kinds of circumstances and reasons for someone to be late for Mass, however, it is extremely distracting for someone to enter the Church during the readings and the singing of the psalm response. Once the readings and the singing of Psalm response are over, we will give everyone chance to be seated before the Priest or Deacon gives the homily. Thank you for your cooperation with this matter.

Samuel was sleeping in the temple of the LORD where the ark of God was.

Then he brought him to Jesus.  
Jesus looked at him and said,  
"You are Simon the son of John;  
you will be called Cephas" — which is translated Peter.

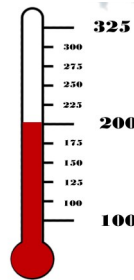
