

Indulgences: The doctrine and practice of indulgences in the Church are closely linked to the effects of the sacrament of Penance. In this sacrament, the sinner, placing himself before the merciful judgment of God, anticipates in a certain way the



judgment which he will be subjected at the end of his earthly life. For it is now, in this life, that we are offered the choice between life and death, and it is only by the road of conversion. A single participation in the sacrament of penance can apply to any reception of a plenary indulgence 20 days before or after going to confession. However, reception of Communion and praying for the intentions of the pope and the pope himself are required for each plenary indulgence.
