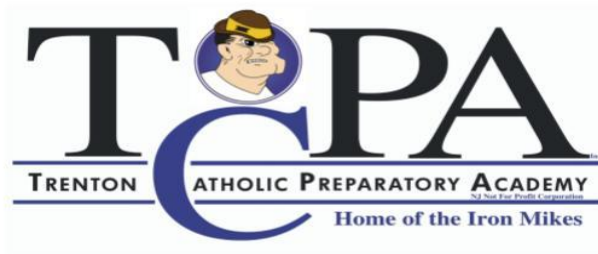

Community

Located on a beautiful, quiet 64-acre campus in suburban Hamilton, NJ, Trenton Catholic Preparatory Academy, Inc. is a PreK - 12 school. With a demanding preparatory curriculum, TCPA prepares a universal population to succeed now, in college and beyond.

School

Our academy is leading the way with outstanding academics, first-rate Robotics and STEM education, Project Lead The Way programs, High School Esports League, First Lego League, developing championship sports teams, and providing a safe and inclusive environment, while also embracing service, diversity, and acceptance for all.

We are anticipating a 100% graduation rate in the upper school and we are projecting over \$3.5 Million in college scholarships and grants to be given to our students.

The Upper and Lower Schools are located in separate wings connected by a corridor. Students share a chapel, gymnasium and cafeteria.

Competitive athletic teams play in top-notch facilities. The gymnasium, baseball, track & field, and soccer fields have received extensive renovations over the last five years.

Curriculum

Trenton Catholic Preparatory Academy offers a comprehensive range of courses designed to meet the academic needs and goals of its diverse student population, with its instruction rooted in the Catholic faith. As a "Project Lead The Way" School, Trenton Catholic Preparatory Academy provides a STEM enhanced curriculum and has a 1:1 student to laptop ratio. Students are encouraged to explore a full range of academic, fine arts and elective courses, as well as participate in extracurricular activities, to expand their knowledge as well-rounded students. Advanced courses are offered online through Catholic Virtual, as well as the opportunity to take college level courses at Mercer County Community College, for students who wish to excel beyond expectations.

Honors courses are offered for English, Mathematics, Science and History. Advanced Placement Courses are offered for English 4, Calculus and Computer Science.

Community Service

Every student is expected to perform 15 hours of community service each year they are enrolled in this school. Students will receive either a passing or incomplete mark on their transcript for their service hours.

Class Rank and Grading

Class rank is based on the student's final grade point average at the end of each academic year from grades 9-11. Senior class rank is calculated at the end of the second marking period to determine valedictorian and salutatorian. Class rank is determined by dividing the number of attempted credits completed into the total value of the grades, using a scale of A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, and F=0. Pass/Fail grades are not included in the calculation of class rank.

Honor Roll

The Honor Roll is calculated for each quarter and is based on quarter grades. The three levels of honors follow:

HONORS WITH DISTINCTION: A student must earn an average of 95 with no rounding and no grade lower than 90.

FIRST HONORS: A student must earn an average of 90 with no rounding and no grade lower than 85.

SECOND HONORS: A student must earn an average of 85 with no rounding and no grade lower than 80.

Student Outcomes

- 95% of students attend a 4-year college or university
- 4% of students attend a 2-year college
- 1% of students enlisted into the military, received technical instruction or went straight into the workforce
