Respecting Life

October has been designated as a month in which we focus on respecting life. Much of this begins with the position of the church that life begins at conception. Science allows us to know so much more about the development of a fetus throughout a pregnancy. We have become immune to the act of abortion as a society and to the unborn who have no one to advocate for them, if not us.

At the same time we have to support young mothers that we encourage to give birth to their children by helping the quality of the lives of both mother and child with education, meaningful employment and other necessities to give them a real chance. That is why we support people like Kathy DiFiore and Chris Bell, our guest this weekend. We cannot merely pray for the unborn, or the mothers who are pregnant, but we need to truly help them.

It makes me think about the broader picture of respecting life. The Catholic Church expresses a consistency in not only holding out life as a value, but quality of life. We see it in end of life issues, where we not only want people to survive but to do so in a meaningful way. This would apply to capital punishment where we do not support the state "playing God" by allowing people to be executed. There can still be stiff penalties like life in prison with no chance of parole.


It also applies to the quality of life for the poor. Not only having food, clothing and shelter, but also other things like meaningful employment and everything else that adds to the quality of life. If we really want to take our Christianity it comes down to an even more basic level. I am talking about the word "respect". We cannot put down, separate or demean our brothers and sisters in the world. There are far too many categories and labels that separate us from one another. I am talking about religion, ethnicity, politics and the list goes on.

So, not just because it is October, let us truly be about respecting life in all of its forms. It is what we believe and what we do as Christ's disciples.






