Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Observe what is right, do what is just; for my salvation is about to come, my justice, about to be revealed.

— Isaiah 56:1

Today's Readings

First Reading Thus says the LORD: "Stand firm in justice; do what is right" (Isaiah 56:1, 6-7).

Psalms O God, let all the nations praise you! (Psalm 67).

Second Reading The gifts and the calling of God are unable to be revoked (Romans 11:13-15, 29-32).

Gospel Recognizing the Canaanite woman's great faith, Jesus told her, "It shall be done as you wish" (Matthew 15:21-28).

The "foreigners" as Isaiah calls them, the "Gentiles" as Paul calls them, or the "Canaanites" as Matthew calls them are called to worship the one true God in prayer. As we listen to today's readings, perhaps we are tempted to ask: Why pray? The question is rhetorical; it is tantamount to asking why should friends talk to one another or people in love kiss one another. Prayer is a way of relating to God, a way of talking to God. The apostles had the opportunity to talk to Jesus in the flesh. We have the opportunity to talk to Jesus Christ in prayer. Our relationship with him must be enthusiastic; it cannot be faint-hearted. John Donne, a fifteenth-century poet, knew what the qualities of good prayer were. Donne asks God to treat him differently from most Christians. The poet does not want God to merely "knock, breathe, shine, and seek to mend," but also to "break, blow, burn, and make me new" (Holy Sonnets, XIV).

It takes a dynamic faith on our part to come to God in prayer. As Jesus once said, "Knock and the door will be opened to you" (Matt 7:7). It may take pounding the door down, but if we are as persistent as the woman in today's Gospel, the results will follow. *Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.*



If so, we sincerely thank you, and if not, it's not too late!
In order to allow time to coordinate logistics, order materials, and set up virtual classrooms, we kindly ask all families to **register by no later than Aug. 21st**. Thank you!

Please read for information on this year's program options:

Dear Religious Education Families,

On behalf of Fr. Tom and our Religious Education staff, we send you our warmest greetings and hope that all is well with your family. Please know that we continue to pray for all of you as we move through this unusual time. We are reaching out to you with updated information regarding our school year religious education programs and additional faith resources for your family.

As always, the health and safety of our families is our highest priority. We have carefully considered the state and archdiocesan requirements, as well as the logistics of shared spaces within our church community. Given the current circumstances, and after much discussion and prayer, the decision has been made to shift religious education programs for this year to a home-based model. We believe that by doing so we will be able to safely and effectively continue our parish religious education programs. As conditions improve and requirements change, we will evaluate the possibility of supplementing our online religious education with small group in-person programming.

Until such time as that becomes possible, all families have two options to choose from for this year's at-home catechesis:

- **Online Religious Education Option 1:** This program will be Google-classroom-based and incorporate online video lessons, a monthly family activity, a short quiz to check for understanding, and Zoom meetings to be scheduled during the year.
- **Textbook-based Religious Education Option 2:** If videos are not the best option for your child, and you are comfortable assuming the role of catechist without the assistance of videos, you can choose to teach directly from the textbook and work with your child at your own pace. A monthly family activity, a brief quiz, and Zoom meetings to be scheduled during the year are also components of this program.

For Grades 1-6:

We will still use our Alive in Christ workbooks for both at-home options. There will be additional activities provided to reinforce the faith themes being learned. We hope to be able to check in with our students and families via Zoom to discuss various faith themes during the year.

For Grades 7-9:

School year plans are in progress, and we will be in touch with you again shortly once things have been finalized and approved. At this time, we can communicate the following information: 1) there will be no option for small group in-home classes, 2) religious education for grades 7-9 is currently scheduled to begin in November, and 3) we will still be using our grade level textbooks.

Visit <https://stcatharinechurch.org/registration-forms> to register online. We ask you to prayerfully consider the information we have provided. We encourage you to register for the program that you anticipate being the best fit for your family at this time.

Please know that we take our responsibility to our families very seriously, and we are hard at work on the development of these programs. We are in communication with the archdiocese and working closely with Fr. Tom to ensure that religious education is a positive experience for your child. We will continue to communicate any changes or developments as we progress through this year. **Please do not hesitate to reach out to us at stcatharinereligioused@gmail.com with any questions or concerns you may have.** As we move closer toward the fall, we hope to meet via Zoom to update you and to be available to answer any questions you might have.

Finally, we want to thank you for your kindness and understanding during these unusual times. We respectfully ask for your continued patience and flexibility regarding religious education programs, plans, and scheduling. By working together, we hope to continue to effectively support your family's journey of faith.

Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading **Is 56:1, 6-7**

Thus says the LORD: Observe what is right, do what is just; for my salvation is about to come, my justice, about to be revealed.

The foreigners who join themselves to the LORD, ministering to him, loving the name of the LORD, and becoming his servants— all who keep the Sabbath free from profanation and hold to my covenant, them I will bring to my holy mountain and make joyful in my house of prayer; their burnt offerings and sacrifices will be acceptable on my altar, for my house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples.

Second Reading **Rom 11:13-15, 29-32**

Brothers and sisters: I am speaking to you Gentiles. Inasmuch as I am the apostle to the Gentiles, I glory in my ministry in order to make my race jealous and thus save some of them. For if their rejection is the reconciliation of the world, what will their acceptance be but life from the dead?

For the gifts and the call of God are irrevocable. Just as you once disobeyed God but have now received mercy because of their disobedience, so they have now disobeyed in order that, by virtue of the mercy shown to you, they too may now receive mercy. For God delivered all to disobedience, that he might have mercy upon all.

Gospel **Mt 15:21-28**

At that time, Jesus withdrew to the region of Tyre and Sidon. And behold, a Canaanite woman of that district came and called out, "Have pity on me, Lord, Son of David! My daughter is tormented by a demon." But Jesus did not say a word in answer to her. Jesus' disciples came and asked him, "Send her away, for she keeps calling out after us." He said in reply, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." But the woman came and did Jesus homage, saying, "Lord, help me." He said in reply, "It is not right to take the food of the children and throw it to the dogs." She said, "Please, Lord, for even the dogs eat the scraps that fall from the table of their masters." Then Jesus said to her in reply, "O woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish." And the woman's daughter was healed from that hour.

For over 30 years, St. Catharine's Reach Out Ministry has been serving meals to the guests at Eva's Village in Paterson several times a year. We prepare the meals on Saturday evening and then serve their 250+ guests on Sunday. Unfortunately, due to Covid19, we are not currently able to provide our regular service.

But... Eva's Village is continuing to provide care for our neighboring community during the pandemic. In March they switched from sit-down-dining, to meals-to-go. Eva's kitchen has been busier than ever, serving 50,000 meals in the first 100 days. Directives for Attending Mass:

BEFORE YOU ARRIVE

Please stay home if you are ill, showing signs of illness or have been exposed to anyone with the virus. Cardinal Tobin has given a dispensation from the obligation to attend mass.

- Please arrive no earlier than 15 minutes prior to the start of mass.
- Please do not gather in the parking lot or on the church steps.
- Please have your mask on when outside of your vehicle. You will not be permitted into the church without a mask.
- Please enter thru the main doors or the Bell Tower and proceed directly to the Narthex.

DURING THE MASS

- Please maintain social distancing at all times.
- Please remember that this is new for all of us. There will be adjustments that need to be made.
- Please place your weekly offering in the basket as you leave the church. There will not be a physical collection taken up. If you have not been using Faith Direct – this is the perfect opportunity to prayerfully consider doing so.
- Please do not have any physical contact during the “Sign of Peace”. A simple nod or wave will suffice.
- Please follow the Monitors instructions for exiting the church. We will dismiss by rows.
- Please do not gather on the church steps or in the parking lot after mass.
- Please join us again for worship.
- Please limit bathroom use to urgent need only.

RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

- Monitors will exit each row into the center aisle
- If waiting online, please stand on the blue tape to ensure social distancing.
- Only the Precious Body will be distributed and it MUST be received on the hand.
- When you approach the Minister, please have hands extended, one over the other.
- Allow the Minister to place the Precious Body in your hand – do not reach for it or take it from the Minister
- Step to the side, place the Eucharist in your mouth, readjust your mask if necessary
- Return to your seat via the side aisle
- If you are NOT receiving, please come forward anyway, cross your hands over your chest and stay in line with others in your row.

WHAT ARE WE DOING TO KEEP EVERYONE SAFE

- All printed material has been removed from the church.
- All Holy Water dips and the font have been drained and will remain empty.
- The church is cleaned and disinfected in between each mass and regularly during the week.
- Bathrooms are cleaned and disinfected in between each mass and regularly during the week.
- Door handles and other touch points are disinfected in between each mass and regularly during the week.
- Hand sanitizers are located throughout the building.
- Entrance has been limited to the Main Doors and the Bell Tower.
- Mask use is strictly enforced.
- Social Distancing measures are in place and will be enforced.
