This Weekend - Knights of Columbus' Annual

Drive to Aid Persons with Intellectual Disabilities



Members of St. Ann's Knights of Columbus Council #2853 and our Columbiette Women's Auxiliary will be conducting their Annual Drive to Aid Persons with Intellectual Disabilities before and after all masses this weekend.

This statewide KofC program has been ongoing by St. Ann's Council since around 1965 with the obvious exception of last year. **In 2019, St. Ann's Council raised \$11,415.92 via collections at 6 churches and various businesses. This figure represented the 5th highest total in NJ out of approximately 350 KofC councils.** We realize that due to the pandemic, we will not be able to come close to the aforementioned figure, but whatever we are able to raise will still be a big plus to the recipient organizations. To that end, we ask that you be as generous as possible in this collection.

This Year More Than Ever

This weekend of Pentecost is a celebration of "church", often referred to as the church's birthday. As things in our area continue to improve and open up, I continue to hope the church, as a meaningful part of your life, will be one of the things that constitutes normalcy. Most parishes are wondering what they will look like in the fall of 2021.

Questions abound about who is coming back? Are there people who joined us during COVID, if so, how do we bring them to find their role? If the parish is smaller, does it prohibit us from maintain our ministry and mission? To that, I would answer a definitive NO. More importantly I see this fall as YES TIME, GO TIME and NOW TIME.

You and I have everything to do about that. If the pandemic taught us anything, it is that we are meant to be connected and separation weakens all of us. I have often used the term 'ownership' when it comes to the parish. We need people to invest in who we are. We need sweat equity, your time, sharing your gifts, to benefit everyone. The more people that take part, the more we really become a parish. There are so many parishes within close proximity, it is easy to find a Sunday Mass at a time that fits our schedule.

It was not so long ago that each Mass time had its' own little community. You would see the same faces week after week. The mask wearing and social distancing somewhat took that away. It might be a sacrifice to wait until 10 when everyone is ready by 9:39 and we can attend another church 5 or 10 minutes away.

What I am talking about is a church, not just a place to attend Mass, but a second family. A place to experience true community. When we did our massive parish-wide poll about five years ago, one of the major priorities listed was community. The parish can run programs and the like, but community comes from a welcoming atmosphere created by its' member.

So what do we do now? Let's begin by praying. Also, start to think about what we should be doing so we can "open up". We are looking to the fall, but maybe we can do some things over the summer. I will be inviting everyone into the process. New ideas are welcome, but with that, we need people who are willing to invest their time. Let's truly celebrate Pentecost as we truly celebrate Saint Catharine.




