Congratulations to our RCIA Candidates, Robert Fabbri and Christopher Park who completed their Sacraments of Initiation at St. Catharine on April 16th. Robert received the Sacrament of Confirmation and Christopher received the Sacraments of First Eucharist and Confirmation.

Each of us has our own journey of faith. Our Catholic faith provides a rich and beautiful means to draw us into a deeper relationship with our Lord. Perhaps you or someone you know has not received all the Sacraments of Initiation (that is, Baptism, Holy Eucharist and Confirmation). Perhaps you may have questions about how our Catholic faith differs from other faith traditions. About what it means to be a Catholic. About how to enter into the Catholic faith more fully.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a process to explore these and other questions as well as enter more fully into the Catholic faith. It is often called a journey of faith in which we welcome others to the Catholic family. It is a program for those

who have never been baptized, were baptized in other faith traditions, or were baptized in the Catholic faith but never completed the Sacraments of Holy Eucharist, or Confirmation.

If you or someone you know wants to learn more about this journey, we will be hosting an RCIA Information Session on Monday, May 1st at 7:30PM in the first floor meeting room in the Ministry Center. FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Dear Parishioners,

Two weeks have passed since Easter Sunday. As we move along through the Easter season, today is the third Sunday of Easter. This is a beautiful season where we celebrate that Jesus has risen as he said he would. Our gospel readings tell us about Jesus' resurrection appearances. What is important for us to remember is that Jesus is present to us just like he was present to his apostles.

In today's gospel, two of Jesus' apostles were walking along a road to a village called Emmaus, talking about Jesus' crucifixion. Jesus joins them and talks with them, but they don't recognize him. Jesus discusses the Scriptures with the apostles and tells them that he had to die to come into his glory. They still don't recognize him.

The apostles invited Jesus to join them where they were staying. When they shared a meal together and Jesus said the blessing, the apostles recognized Him. In the breaking of the bread, the Eucharistic experience, they recognize Jesus!

As we celebrate the risen Christ, let's stay open to recognizing Him in our own lives. Jesus is present to us in one another. In our kindness to each other, we show the other person that we see Christ in him or her. At the same time, we let the other person see Christ in us.

Jesus is present to us in the liturgy. He is present to us in his word in Scripture and in the Eucharist. Like the apostles on the road to Emmaus, we can hear Jesus as we listen to the Scriptures. Like those same apostles, we can recognize Jesus in the breaking of the bread.


