According to research by my predecessors, the Jesuit day books showed the following:

Good weather wasn't always the case. In 1897, the picnic was postponed for two days and then finally held on the third day. In 1893, it was recommended that in the future:

- a) A 5 cent admission fee be added in order to keep out tramps;
- b) The ladies be given a measure for sandwich making; and,
- c) The dance pavilion be railed off.

In 1895, Mother Ignatia kept the sisters at the convent in the morning for fear of wet grass. They were allowed to go the picnic at Noon.
