# ABOUT THE MISSION IN THE ARCHDIOCESE OF KUMASI, GHANA

The Archdiocese of Kumasi, in Ghana (West Africa), was established in 1950 by missionaries. During the past 45 years the growth of the Church in Ghana has been blessed and currently there are 16 dioceses and 4 archdioceses. The city of Kumasi, the seat of the Archdiocese of Kumasi has a population of about 2,437,000 people; many living in rural settings. The Catholic population is around 365,000. The work of evangelization takes many forms and continues through the generous support of Catholics worldwide.

The Church's healing ministry and efforts in primary evangelization become evident through projects aimed at improving the health and well-being of people such as the building and upgrading of health clinics, the care for street children and providing accessible, clean drinking water by building new wells, especially on school grounds. It is surprising that there are still many areas where people walk a great distance for clean drinking water.

Your support, also assists in the building of new schools for the education of youth and for spiritual growth. Teachers are in short supply and a new Teachers' College, Christ the Teacher College of Education, has recently opened for the formation of Catholic teachers. In addition to the academic disciplines, the student-teachers to be trained here will be exposed to Catholic theology and the social teachings of the Church in order to become agents of evangelization in their interaction with students at primary, junior high and senior high levels.

Contributions received, also, benefit Saint Gregory the Great Major Seminary. The generous contributions we have received have helped give rise to an increase of vocations in the Archdiocese. Archbishop Gabriel J. Anokye expresses his gratitude to the Church in America and acknowledges that the generosity of American Catholics has immensely improved the condition of many people of Kumasi and has aided the growth of the Church in Africa as a whole.

We thank you in anticipation for your welcome and hospitality offered to Father Moses Attah, our missionary

representative visiting your parish community and for the support you offer. We truly, appreciate the prayers and contributions we receive and strive to be good stewards of what we receive so that it may have the greatest possible positive impact. Your parish family will be remembered in Masses and prayers offered by the priests, deacons, religious, and missionaries serving in the Archdiocese of Kumasi, Ghana.

# **Building & Grounds**

- <u>Rectory and STC Windows</u>: A painting contractor is currently scraping and repainting the windows on the rectory and the 1902 school.
- <u>Convent Porch</u>: The porch of the Saint Joseph Convent is being renovated this month. There were some cracking issues on the second floor above the porch. An engineer inspected the area and determined that the issue will correct itself once the porch is restored and the porch is back in its proper place. The foundation was inspected and was found to be in excellent condition.
- <u>Barn</u>: We are exploring the possibility of converting the barn into a center for various parish activities: meeting space, gift shop, museum etc. More info to come.
- <u>Security Cameras</u>: A benefactor has donated security cameras for the school. One will also be located near the entrance of the church.

# Parish History Spotlight

Over 225 years ago, the Servant of God Demetrius Augustine Gallitzin was ordained a Catholic priest by Bishop John Carroll of Baltimore- on March 18, 1795. He was the first person to receive all of his sacred orders here in the United States. Fr. Gallitzin (then known as "Fr. Smith") was immediately assigned to our parish. He served here for a short time before becoming "The Apostle of the Alleghenies." In 1799, Fr. Gallitzin was sent to "McGuire's Settlement" (now Loretto, PA)- where he spent the rest of his life serving as a parish priest. Gallitzin's coat of arms are in the back of the church along the wall near the entrance to the Our Lady's Chapel. For more information on this incredible priest and



saintly man, check out the 1999 book: *Apostle of the Alleghenies, Reverend Demetrius Augustine Gallitzin* by Margaret and Matthew Bunson. Gallitzin is buried at Saint Michael's Church in Loretto, PA. May he continue to pray for our community to grow in our love for the Lord.

# Stewardship Through Estate Planning

# None of us lives for oneself, and no one dies for oneself. For if we live, we live for the Lord, and if we die, we die for the Lord; so then, whether we live or die, we are the Lord's. - Romans 14: 7-8

Consider one of the greatest acts of stewardship an individual can make- by establishing an estate plan. Everyone should have an estate plan comprised of either a will or a trust. A will is a legal document that allows you to control how your assets are distributed **after** your lifetime. Without a will, the probate court will decide who acquires your assets upon your death. Typically, the court will divide your assets between your surviving spouse and children, or your blood relatives. The court will not provide for any charitable intentions you may have.

A trust allows you to control how your assets are distributed **both during and after** your lifetime. Establishing a trust requires that you transfer ownership or title of your assets to the name of your trust. Since the trust owns the assets, there is nothing for the courts to control when you die. This is beneficial since, unlike a will, you avoid all the costs, delays and publicity of the probate process. However, depending on its complexity, a trust can be more expensive to create than a will.

Most importantly, an estate plan allows you to determine how and to whom the gifts God has bestowed on you will be distributed when you can no longer serve as your own steward. For detailed questions on wills or trusts, contact an estate planning attorney. If you are planning on giving to a charity, please consider *Sacred Heart Basilica* as part of your estate plan. The Office of Stewardship & Development at the Diocese of Harrisburg (717-657-4804) can provide sample language that you can share with your advisors when considering a charitable gift to the parish.

Arrive at the Shrine between 9:00am and 10:00am and spend the morning hours in prayer on your own or with your small group. Diocesan Priests— including Father Schlaline- will be available to



hear your confession between 9:30am and 11:00am in the vicinity of Saint Mary's Chapel on the Hill. The Pilgrim's Mass will be celebrated at 1:00pm, followed by a Eucharistic Holy Hour with spiritual reflection, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, and Benediction.
