Thoughts on Halloween from an Exorcist

On Sunday July 6th, Father Schlaline preached about exorcisms and referred to a book by a well-respected priest-psychologist who has become an exorcist. His reflections regarding Halloween are interesting and worth pondering:

Exorcist Diary 86: Halloween Will Be Ugly

I am starting to prepare spiritually for All Hallows' Eve. No bags of candy. No costumes. No pumpkins. As every year, it will be ugly. Many of our spiritual sensitives* will get pummeled by demons. One year, our team decided to pray over one of our most gifted people throughout the night, trying to shield her from the demonic attacks she has suffered yearly. It didn't work. She got thrashed anyway. But she said she appreciated our efforts.


Several of our other sensitives will experience increased demonic harassment. Many of our clients who are possessed or severely oppressed will suffer more intensely throughout the night. The priest exorcists themselves will typically get bombarded with demonic obsessions and an internal battle. There are times during the year when the demonic is more powerful than usual, and Halloween is at the top of the list. It is the demons' distortion of the great feast of All Saints on the following day. Moreover, Satan's human minions will join in and cast curses, spells, and all sorts of evil, which doesn't help.

I wonder about parents who dress up their children as devils or witches. Do they have any idea? I do not know about the spiritual effects of such Halloween practices on the general population. But on the possessed and on exorcism teams, the night will typically be a time of trial. Our little team will spend the evening in Eucharistic adoration, keeping vigil. We will await the dawn and the feast of All Saints. Then we will celebrate the myriads of holy people who daily surround us and come to our aid. The radiance of divine light shining through them will cast out the darkness. Once again, there will be peace.

*"Spiritual sensitives" are persons who assist with exorcisms but are not the primary exorcist. They are acutely aware of spiritual realities that most people cannot detect or simply ignore. Thus, Msgr. Rosetti calls them "spiritual sensitives."

Stewardship Through Estate Planning

None of us lives for oneself, and no one dies for oneself. For if we live, we live for the Lord, and if we die, we die for the Lord; so then, whether we live or die, we are the Lord's. - Romans 14: 7-8

Consider one of the greatest acts of stewardship an individual can make by establishing an estate plan. Everyone should have an estate plan comprising of either a will or a trust. A will is a legal document that allows you to control how your assets are distributed after your lifetime. Without a will, the probate court will decide who acquires your assets upon your death. Typically, the court will divide your assets between your surviving spouse and children, or your blood relatives. The court will not provide for any charitable intentions you may have.

A trust allows you to control how your assets are distributed **both during and after** your lifetime. Establishing a trust requires that you transfer ownership or title of your assets to the name of your trust. Since the trust owns the assets, there is nothing for the courts to control when you die. This is beneficial since, unlike a will, you avoid all the costs, delays and publicity of the probate process. However, depending on its complexity, a trust can be more expensive to create than a will.

Most importantly, an estate plan allows you to determine how and to whom the gifts God has bestowed on you will be distributed when you can no longer serve as your own steward. For detailed questions on wills or trusts, contact an estate planning attorney. If you are planning on giving to a charity, please consider *Sacred Heart Basilica* as part of your estate plan. The Office of Stewardship & Development at the Diocese of Harrisburg (call 717-657-4804) can provide sample language that you can share with your advisors when considering a charitable gift to the parish.
