SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Genesis 18:1-10a

The Lord appeared to Abraham, who saw three men standing near his tent. Sensing they were messengers, he hurriedly brought them food and water to refresh themselves. Upon leaving, the men told him that they would visit in a year, at which time his childless wife Sarah would have a son.

Second Reading: Colossians 1:24-28

Paul discusses the suffering Christ endured for his Church. He describes his willingness to also endure suffering in Jesus' name. Paul hopes that through his sacrifices, many people will become complete in Jesus.

Gospel: Luke 10:38-42

Jesus was welcomed into the home of a woman named Martha. She complained to Jesus that her sister Mary sat listening to him instead of helping with the tasks of entertaining. Jesus told Martha that her sister had chosen the more important task, and should be allowed to listen.

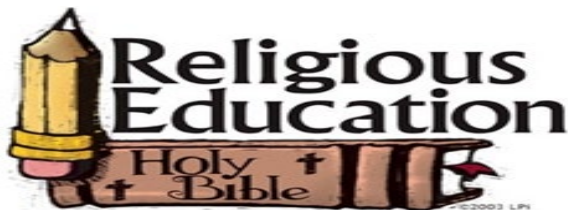

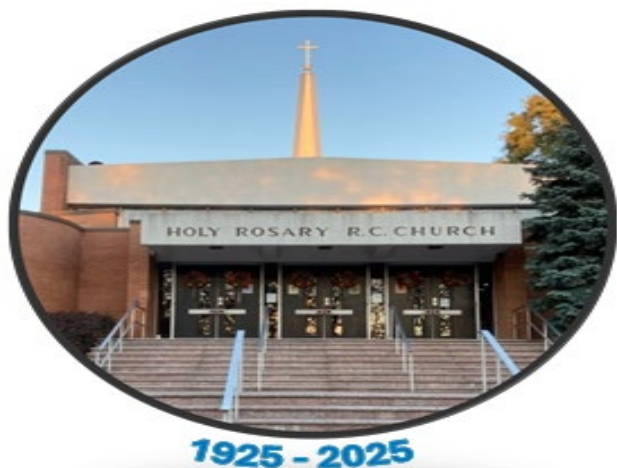

JULY IS THE MONTH OF THE PRECIOUS BLOOD



The feast of the Precious Blood was instituted in 1849 by Pius IX, but the devotion is as old as Christianity. The early Fathers say that the Church was born from the pierced side of Christ, and that the sacraments were brought forth through His Blood.

"The Precious Blood which we worship is the Blood which the Savior shed for us on Calvary and reassumed at His glorious Resurrection; it is the Blood which courses through the veins of His risen, glorified, living body at the right hand of God the Father in heaven; it is the Blood made present on our altars by the words of Consecration; it is the Blood which merited sanctifying grace for us and through it washes and beautifies our soul and inaugurates the beginning of eternal life in it."

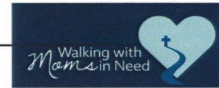
PARISHIONERS WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

Dear Friends in Christ,
We have been stunned by your generosity. We praise God for the way His loving providence has been revealed through you, in every last pack of diapers, bottle of baby wash, and outfit that you brought to the storeroom. Through you, our moms have experienced the tender and maternal love of the Church.

Many mothers have walked through our doors (at least 400 so far, to be exact) and found material help for themselves and their children. Commuting from the Bronx, Brooklyn, even Westchester county, they come because there's no place like it. Your gift is no small thing. Thank you for allowing us to reveal the love of the Heart of Jesus by providing for our mothers who come to the Mommy Storeroom. This would never be possible without you.

The number of mothers we serve has begun to grow as the weather gets warmer. For the most part, we serve anywhere from 35-45 moms on any given Saturday.

We recently shattered our record and served 59 moms on Mother's Day alone, and we welcomed 159 moms total in May 2025. Here's a snapshot of our numbers as we entered 2025-->

We can't express enough how grateful we are for you. The Father has truly directed your work; every time the storeroom is filled with empty shelves, someone shows up with the donations we need. And with the number of moms we serve, donations are flying off the shelves. If you'd like to know what items we are most in need of, please be in contact with us.
