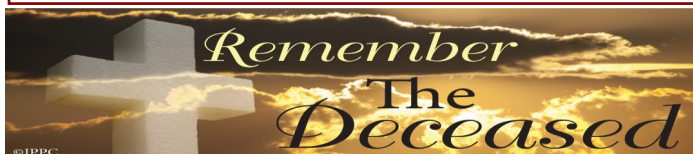

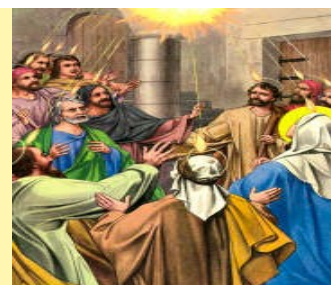


Pentecost Sunday

And when the days of Pentecost were drawing to a close, they were all together in one place. And suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a violent wind coming, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them parted tongues as of fire, which settled upon each of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in foreign tongues, even as the Holy Spirit prompted them to speak (*Acts 2, 1-4*).

Pentecost

(Whitsunday), with Christmas and Easter, ranks among the great feasts of Christianity. It commemorates not only the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and Disciples, but also the fruits and effects of that event: the completion of the work of redemption, the fullness of grace for the Church and its children, and the gift of faith for all nations.



TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — Filled with the Holy Spirit, the apostles begin to speak in tongues (*Acts 2:1-11*).

Psalms — Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth (*Psalms 104*).

Second Reading — In one Spirit we are baptized into one body and given to drink of one Spirit (*1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13*).

Gospel — Jesus Christ appears to the disciples and sends them on their mission with the power to forgive or retain sins through the Holy Spirit (*John 20:19-23*).

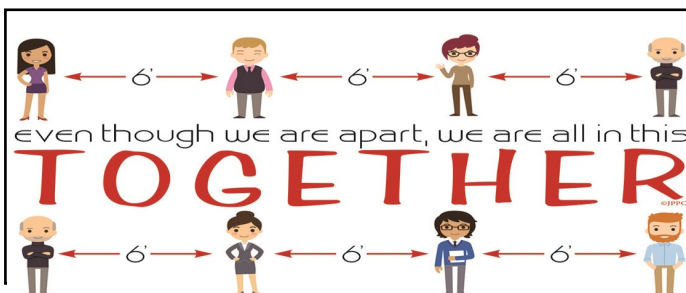

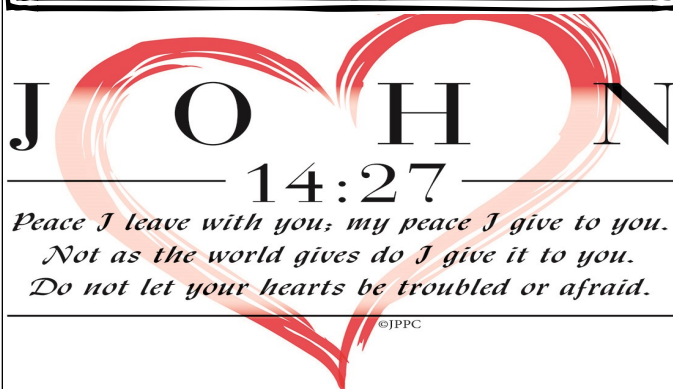
Unfortunately we are not ready to open the church for Masses this weekend.

UMass Foundation

Stanley Jez Scholarship

This scholarship is open to students majoring in (or planning to major in) forestry, environmental science, or arboriculture at UMass Amherst.

Qualified students are ranked in order of consideration by the following: Catholic students from Holy Trinity Parish, Westfield, Catholic students from any parochial school in the Diocese of Springfield. Catholic students from public or private schools in the Diocese of Springfield and recommended by the Bishop of Springfield.** Catholic students from any Catholic diocese in MA. and recommended by their Bishop.** Other students in the College of Natural Sciences majoring in forestry, environmental science or arboriculture. **Letter from the Bishop must be sent to the UMass Foundation Scholarship Committee for application to be considered. This application is good for one academic year only and due ASAP. Returning students must submit a renewal application.
