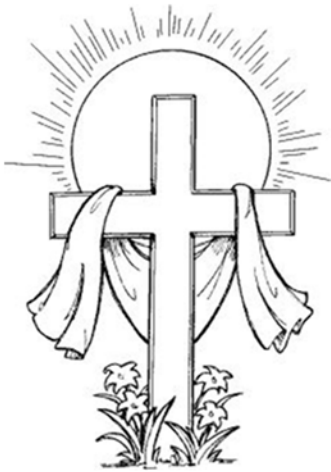

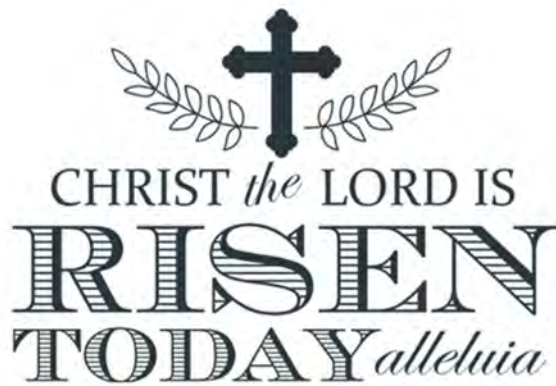


From Fr. Peter McGeory: HE IS RISEN! HE IS RISEN INDEED! ALLELUIA!

This is the common greeting on Easter Sunday in many parts of the world among believers. It has been a long winter and a long Lent, hasn't it? Yet, now the weather is starting to get warmer, the days longer, and the trees and flowers will soon be ready to bloom. Life returns to nature and we Christians bask in the new light of the risen Jesus. It is a wonderful time of year. A very warm welcome to all who are visiting St Joseph's today perhaps with family or friends. I hope you feel right at home here in our family of faith. Travel safely and come back to us often.

A warm welcome, too, to Catholics who may be here today rethinking their commitment to Jesus and the Church. Easter is the perfect time to do this, isn't it? Even the Apostles who weren't very faithful in Holy Week needed to rethink their commitment to Jesus. We have all been in the position of being His prodigal sons and daughters, haven't we? EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD

First Reading: Acts 10:34a, 37-43

Peter discusses Jesus' life of preaching and healing. Jesus was crucified, then he rose up and was seen by his chosen witnesses. Peter also mentions the importance of all the disciples bearing witness to what they saw, so that many people would believe in Jesus, and have their sins forgiven through him.

Second Reading: Colossians 3:1-4

Paul asserts that we must pay attention to higher realms rather than earthly concerns. Our life is not yet completely known to us, until Christ appears and we are raised to glory in him.

Gospel: John 20:1-9

When Mary Magdalene discovered Jesus' tomb was open, she told Simon Peter and another disciple. They ran to the tomb and Peter went inside. He found the burial wrappings on the ground, with the head covering separate from the rest. The other disciple came in and they believed what they saw, although until then they had not understood the Scripture's message of Jesus' resurrection.

CARDINAL'S APPEAL 2021

We have just recently concluded the 2020 Cardinal's Appeal. Despite all the problems associated with COVID, St Joseph's heroically pledged \$336K from just over 400 families. I can't thank you enough for such a stellar example of good stewardship.

By now, however, many of you may have received Cardinal Dolan's letter announcing the Appeal for 2021. Given the financial impact COVID has had on so many poor families in the Archdiocese, they need our generosity now more than ever. The vast majority of the Appeal (48%) is going now to parishes that are financially stricken---right in our backyard. More and more money is needed to support feeding programs and essential human services. Funds are also directed to help our young seminarians and our senior retired priests. In short, the Cardinal's Appeal assists so many in our Archdiocese to bring so many both help and hope.

If you have never given to the Appeal, I urge you to do so. We all remember what Jesus said: "Whatever you do for the least of my brothers and sisters, you do for Me."

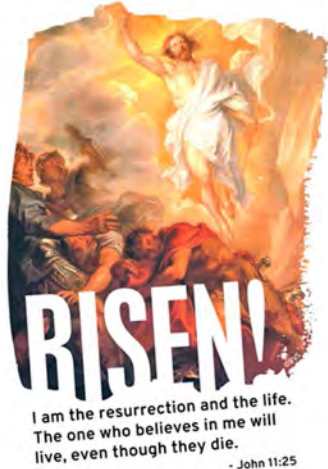

HIS WORD TODAY: A Fresh Perspective On The Sunday Readings - By Rev. William J. Reilly

"You know what happened all over Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power. He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses of all he did both in the country of the Jews and all Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree. This man God raised on the third day and granted that he be visible, not to all the people but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead."



This sermon of Peter, one of many in the Acts of the Apostles, summarizes well the reason for our belief today. His words sum up the mission of Jesus as part of the plan of God. He went about doing good and healing all.

The work of Jesus continues today in His church. The presence of the Risen Christ summons us to continue His work. Rather than criticize and complain, consider whether I am a true witness of Christ for others and ask how can I bring the message of His presence to others. Jesus lives and He lives in us today. Happy Easter.
