## FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT ♦ NOVEMBER 27, 2022

***The Advent of our King is Near!***

*Next Sunday marks the start of a new Church year and the beginning of the season of Advent. We invite you to join our parish during these advent weeks to WATCH, PREPARE, REJOICE, and BEHOLD the great mystery of Christmas!*

### **O come, O come, Emmanuel!**

Today is the first Sunday of Advent, which is also the first Sunday of the new year in the Church's calendar. The Advent season includes the four Sundays that precede Christmas. It is the coming of Child Jesus in Bethlehem, which we anticipate and prepare for in these four weeks.

The key themes of the Advent season are:

**Watchful waiting, Preparation, and Justice.**

This period is appropriately called "Advent." The term comes from a Latin word *adventus* simply means 'coming.' We immediately think it refers to the coming of Jesus at Christmastime and that is correct. But it is not the whole story. In fact, we speak of three comings of the Lord. They are First Coming of the Lord in the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem and the Second Coming of the Lord in majesty at the end of time. However, there is still a Third Coming, which takes place in our daily lives. It forms an important and indispensable link between the First and Second Comings.

Today's Mass says very little about the first coming of Jesus, or about his birth in Bethlehem. The passage from Matthew (24:37-44) we read today is rather straightforward. No one knows the precise time of the coming of the Lord in glory, so watchful waiting and vigilance are required. The passage speaks to the uselessness of looking for signs; there will be none. As a thief sneaks in during the night, so will the Lord's coming in glory be.

**The question for us as members of the Christian community, then, is how do we prepare for this?**

Today's passage speaks more about the manner of waiting, rather than the details of the preparation. Jesus compares the vigilance required of Christians to the vigilance of a homeowner who knows the plans of the thief. If one knows that the thief's action is imminent, one remains watchful. As Christians, we know that our Lord is coming even if we cannot know the precise timing. Jesus calls us to be watchful and vigilant, like the homeowner. **If we become lax in our Christian living, we may be caught unprepared.**

#### **JESUS NEEDS YOUR SOCKS**

*We all know the Gospel story in Mt 25 when Jesus will come in glory at the end of time; He will separate us-- the sheep from the goats; the good from the bad; the doers from the spectators. Jesus tells us that our treatment of the poor and the needy will testify to the genuineness of our faith. Yes, actions---however simple---speak louder than our words.*

*Normally, on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Advent, our 1<sup>st</sup> graders come to Church with their 'stockings for Jesus' that are filled with much-needed toiletries for the poor and the homeless in NYC. Many of the little ones also put in a short note to the person who will receive these 'Jesus Socks' to tell them of the prayers and love we have for each of them. They are the living face of the suffering Jesus in our midst. Over the years, many other children of all grades --along with many adults-- have joined in this simple yet poignant corporal act of mercy. What a great way to prepare for Christmas! Come to the 9:30 Mass on December 4<sup>th</sup> with your 'Jesus Stocking.' If you can't come to the 9:30 Mass, come to ANY Mass on the 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> of December and place your 'Jesus Stocking' in the big boxes in front of the altar.*

*Remember Jesus' words: "Whatsoever you do for the LEAST of my brethren, you do for Me!"*

*Have a blessed Advent as we all try to 'remember the reason for the season.'*

### **Regarding Letters of Sponsorship for Baptism and Confirmation**

We receive many requests for "Letters of Sponsorship". Many of the requests come from people who have little or no association with St. Joseph's Parish.

In order for us to honestly testify to your good standing as a parishioner, these are the basic requirements:

- One must be an active parishioner of St Joseph's for at least 6 months. This means: one must be registered here and you MUST be attending Mass. Being an 'active' parishioner also means you are committed to some form of stewardship of your time, talent and financial resources to help support the parish and the Church of the Archdiocese of New York.
- You MUST have received the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation yourself.
- If married, you must be in a Catholic Church recognized marriage.

If these minimum requirements are not fulfilled, it is **NOT** possible for any of the priests to endorse your sponsorship for the Sacraments of Baptism or Confirmation.
