WEEKDAY SUNG MASSES

Please note well that during the months of July and August all Masses Monday through Saturday will be Low Masses until after Labor Day. The only exceptions will be the Feast of the Assumption on August 15.

LABOR DAY SCHEDULE

Holy Innocents will follow a somewhat abbreviated schedule on Monday, September 3 in observance of Labor Day. Masses will be celebrated at 7:00 & 7:30 a.m. and 12:15 p.m. in English and at 1:15 p.m. in Latin. There will be no 6:00 p.m. Mass nor Exposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament. Confessions will be heard from 7:30 to 8:30 a.m. and 12 noon to 1:30 p.m. The church will close shortly after the 1:15 p.m. Mass. The regular schedule will resume on Tuesday, September 4.

FIRST SATURDAY DEVOTIONS

Saturday, September 1st is the First Saturday of the month. Following the 1:00 p.m. Mass there will be the recitation of the Holy Rosary, a 15-minute meditation on the mysteries of the Holy Rosary, and benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament. Plan on attending to make reparation to the Sorrowful and Immaculate Heart of Mary.

NOVENA SIRNATION

54 DAY ROSARY NOVENA FOR OUR NATION

The time is now to call upon God, through the powerful intercession of Our Lady of the Rosary, to heal our country and return it to holiness.

If *Roe* is overturned, the democratic process—not the courts—will determine abortion policy

Before *Roe*, all states permitted abortion if necessary to save the mother's life, and some permitted abortion in additional circumstances. But *Roe* deemed any prohibition on abortion as unconstitutional.

If *Roe* is overturned, policy decisions about abortion will be made by the citizens of each state through the democratic process, rather than by courts. Some states will place limits on abortion, in others there will likely be few limits.

Not until *Roe v. Wade* is reversed will the people again be able to govern themselves on the important public policy issue of abortion.

Once, the (*Divine Mercy*) image was being exhibited over the altar during the Corpus Christy procession... When the priest exposed the Blessed Sacrament, and the choir began to sing, the rays from the image pierced the Sacred Host and spread out all over the world. Then I heard these words: These rays of mercy will pass through you, just as they have passed through this Host,

and they will go out through all the world. At these words, profound joy invaded my soul. (Diary ,441)

Adoration has been a central Catholic devotion for centuries, beloved by saints, popes, and countless devout men, women, and children.


Among them was St. Faustina — who added "of the Blessed Sacrament" to her religious name:

One hour spent at the foot of the altar in the greatest dryness of spirit is dearer to me than a hundred years of worldly pleasure. (Diary ,254)

Striving to be in constant union with Jesus, she visited the Blessed Sacrament throughout her day as much and often as possible, sometimes if only to quickly genuflect at the chapel's door as she passed by, smiling to Our Lord.

FATHER EUGÈNE PRÉVOST

Father Eugène Prévost was born in 1860 in Saint-Jérôme, province of Quebec and studied in the Montreal area before embarking for Brussels, where he became the first Canadian novice of the Fathers of the Blessed Sacrament founded by St. Peter Julian Eymard. He had a fruitful apostolate as director of the association of Priests Adorers. With the support of Pope Leo XIII, he then left his community to found two new congregations, the Sacerdotal Fraternity and the Sisters Oblates of Bethany. His goal: to help the clergy, especially those experiencing difficulties of any kind, while glorifying




Jesus Priest, source of all priesthood. Members of the Fraternity and the Oblates continue to offer their lives for priests, through discreet assistance and daily Eucharistic adoration, in Canada, France and Colombia. Fr. Provost died in 1946. His cause of beatification and canonization was opened in July 4, 2012 in the Cathedral of Three Rivers, Canada.

- ..# After the Eucharist and the Blessed Virgin, nothing has ever touched, ravished and inflamed me so much as the dignity, the greatness, the virtual divinity of a priest, considering his resemblance with Jesus and his incomparable and unfathomable power to consecrate the Eucharist.
- ..# After the soul of Mary, nothing is so beautiful as the soul of a priest: Jesus in miniature, the Infinite beneath the exterior of a creature... There are two great sacraments that go hand in hand: the Eucharist and the Priesthood.
- ...# Priests! They are multipliers! May the Holy Eucharist become the center of their thoughts, the goal of their labors; there they will have the most efficacious means of converting and sanctifying their people.
- ...# O Jesus, in Your presence we quickly forget the miseries of the earth; You throw a veil over the sorrows of the earth and You light up the firmament with the brightness of Heaven!

ALL-NIGHT VIGIL

Beginning this month the monthly All-Night Vigil will be suspended permanently. This change is due to a variety of reasons (lack of servers for the early morning Saturday Mass, the on-going problem of the church being used as a flophouse for the night with eating/drinking and a mess being left for the sacristan on Saturday morning, etc.) Over a year ago a proposal was made that order is to be maintained in the church throughout the night or the Vigil would be suspended all together. There was an improvement for a while but now it is back to where it was a year ago. This is no one's fault but the reality of being very near Times Square in the heart of the City of Manhattan. Sleeping/snoring, lounging, eating, drinking and talking are all disrespectful behaviors toward the Blessed Sacrament and is not to be tolerated under any circumstances.

A Holy Hour of Reparation to the Sacred Heart will follow the 6:00 p.m. each First Friday.
