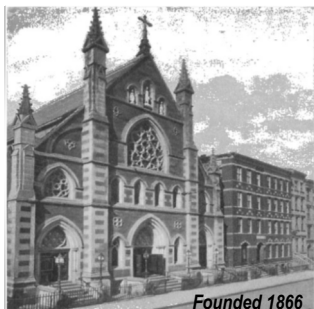

NOVENA TO THE HOLY SPIRIT

The Novena to the Holy Spirit was first prayed by Our Lady and the Apostles in the Upper Room following the Ascension of the Lord, thus making this the first Novena ever.

PENTECOST SUNDAY

Next Sunday is the Feast of Pentecost and the Birthday of the Church. Plan on wearing something red to Holy Mass next weekend to celebrate the Fire of the Holy Spirit!

PLENARY INDULGENCE

THE TWELVE PROMISES OF THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS FOR THOSE WHO ARE FAITHFULLY DEVOTED

1. I will give them all the graces necessary for their state of life.
2. I will give peace in their families.
3. I will console them in all their troubles.
4. I will be their refuge in life and especially in death.
5. I will abundantly bless all their undertakings.
6. Sinners shall find in my Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
7. Tepid souls shall become fervent.
8. Fervent souls shall rise speedily to great perfection.
9. I will bless those places wherein the image of My Sacred Heart shall be exposed and venerated.
10. I will give to priests the power to touch the most hardened hearts.
11. Persons who propagate this devotion shall have their names eternally written in my Heart.
12. In the excess of the mercy of my Heart, I promise you that my all powerful love will grant to all those who will receive Communion on the First Fridays, for nine consecutive months, the grace of final repentance: they will not die in my displeasure, nor without receiving the sacraments; and my Heart will be their secure refuge in that last hour.

You may pray the Novena any nine days of the year, but if you on June 20, you will end on the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus which will be celebrated on June 28.

THE MSGR. ALOYSIUS DINEEN MONSTRANCE

Msgr. Aloysius Dineen, who was Pastor of the Shrine & Parish Church of the Holy Innocents from 1931-1951, commissioned a beautiful monstrance to be used for the daily exposition and adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament. On the base of this sacred vessel is the engraving: *"This Ostensorium was made from gold, silver and precious stones given by parishioners, friends and passers-by. Pray for their intentions. Rev. Aloysius C. Dineen, Pastor"* For years, this monstrance has been in disrepair. It was recently fixed and replated, restoring it to its pristine condition. This restored monstrance will be blessed and used for the first time on the Feast of Corpus Christi, Thursday, June 20.



JUNE - Month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus

History of the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus

Devotion to the Sacred Heart is a form of devotion to the person Jesus, and especially to His Love.

The *Catholic Encyclopedia* details a history of this devotion. It observed that from the time of Saint John and Saint Paul there has always been in the Church something like devotion to the love of God, Who so loved the world as to give it His only-begotten Son, and to the love of Jesus, Who has so loved us as to deliver Himself up for us. But, accurately speaking, this is not the devotion to the Sacred Heart, as it pays no homage to the Heart of Jesus as the symbol of His love for us. From the earliest centuries, Christ's open side and the mystery of blood and water were meditated upon, and the Church was beheld issuing from the side of Jesus, as Eve came forth from the side of Adam. But there is nothing to indicate that, during the first ten centuries, any worship was rendered the wounded Heart.

It is in the eleventh and twelfth centuries that we find the first unmistakable indications of devotion to the Sacred Heart. Through the wound in the side the wounded Heart was gradually reached, and the wound in the Heart symbolized the wound of Divine Love. In the Benedictine and Cistercian monasteries devotion arose, although it is impossible to say what where the first texts. Saint Gertrude (d. 1302) had a vision on the feast of John the Evangelist. She was resting her head near the wound in the Savior's side and hearing the beating of the Divine Heart. She asked Saint John if on the night of the Last Supper, he had felt these delightful pulsations, why he had never spoken of the fact. Saint John replied that this revelation had been reserved for subsequent ages when the world, having grown cold, would have need of it to rekindle its love.

From the thirteenth to the sixteenth century, the devotion was practiced as a private, individual devotion of the mystical order. In the sixteenth century, the devotion took an onward step and passed from the domain of mysticism into that of Christian asceticism. It was constituted an objective devotion with prayers already formulated and special exercises of which the value was extolled and practice commended.

The devotion to the Sacred Heart developed further during the seventeenth century. Ascetic writers spoke of it, especially those of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits), Alvarez de Paz, Luis de la Puente, Saint-Jure and Nouet and Father Druzbecki, small work "*Meta Cordium, Cor Jesu*".

The devotion was greatly increased by the visions Sister Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-1690), a French Visitationist nun at the convent of Paray-le-Monial. She had a vision of Christ's Heart on the feast of Saint John that was similar to that of Saint Gertrude. Jesus permitted her to rest her head upon His Heart, and then disclosed to her the wonders of His love, telling her that He desired to make this known to mankind and to diffuse the treasures of His goodness, and that He had chosen her for this work, (probably 1673, Dec. 27). In June or July of 1674, Sister Margaret Mary said, Jesus asked to be honored under the figure of His Heart of Flesh and asked for a devotion of expiatory love — frequent Communion, Communion on the first Friday of each month and the observance of Holy Hours.

In another vision, on the feast of Corpus Christi 1675, Sister Margaret Mary reported that Jesus told her, "Behold the Heart that has so loved men...instead of gratitude I receive from the greater part (of mankind) only ingratitude..." Jesus then asked for a feast of reparation on the Friday after the octave of *Corpus Christi*, bidding her to consult Father de la Colombière, then superior of the small Jesuit house at Paray. He recognized the action of the Spirit of God and consecrated himself to the Sacred Heart and directed Sister Margaret Mary to write down her account and to circulate it throughout France and England. Sister Margaret Mary Alacoque was canonized in the 20th century.

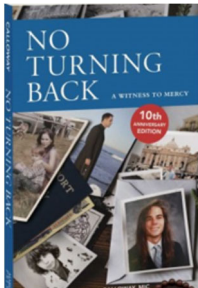

RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

When referring to the reception of Holy Communion, the term "Communion on the tongue" is used. The term "Communion in the mouth" was never used. And this is because Holy Communion is to be placed on the tongue of the communicant, and not put into the mouth. And so when receiving Holy Communion please observe the following:



- 1) Extend your tongue far enough for the priest to place the Sacred Host upon it.
- 2) Do not simply open your mouth without extending your tongue, forcing the priest to insert the Sacred Host into your mouth. He should not have to place his fingers into your mouth.
- 3) Do not grab the Host or lunge at the priest's fingers, jerking your head forward. As he approaches you, slightly tilt your head back, open your mouth, and extend your tongue **without moving your head or tongue**. This will ensure that the priest's fingers do not come in contact with your tongue and mouth. Remember, he must purify his fingers and drink the ablutions. The thought is not a pleasant one when someone's saliva is on the fingers!!
- 4) When the Sacred Host is placed onto your tongue, close your mouth and return to your pew.

While all of this sounds elementary and like common sense, it is brought up because a number of people do not know how to receive Holy Communion on the tongue. There are those who just open the mouth without extending the tongue. There are some who lunge at the priest's fingers as if they are going to grab the host and bite his fingers. If you are not doing the above, please familiarize yourself with how to receive Holy Communion on the Tongue properly and begin to do it.
