LIVING OUR FAITH: To Be in the Presence of the Holy

Jesus takes Peter, James and John up a mountain and the three get a glimpse of Jesus' future glory in the company of Moses and Elijah. Perhaps the amazing aspect of these passages is that the disciples are not surprised by the vision. They act as if the vision and their ability to see it are an ordinary occurrence. Do they not realize the significance of what they are encountering?

Not until they hear God's voice do the disciples' attitudes change - they fall to the ground and are "very much afraid." To be in the presence of the holy is a shattering, terrifying experience in the Hebrew Scriptures. God is set apart from the people. Both the Hebrew and Greek word for "holy" means "set apart."

Jesus, "the beloved Son," changes all that by his very being - "the Word became flesh and dwelt among us" - and his actions: touching the disciples while encouraging them to "rise and do not be afraid."

Questions: What is my definition of holiness? Who exemplifies holiness to me? How can I be more attentive to the presence of the holy in my life this Lent?
