

In St. Mark's gospel, as Jesus nears Jerusalem, there is a sense that the disciples are still hoping for a tangible victory that will usher in Jesus' earthly kingship. Jesus predicts his passion, death and resurrection three times in this gospel. Over the past six weeks, we read the first and second predictions. The third comes right before James and John's request in today's gospel. This prediction offers even more details of how Jesus' passion will play out, noting that the Son of Man will be mocked, spit upon and scourged. The path to Jesus' glory lies in the shadow of the cross. And this is true not only for him, but for all those who choose to follow him.

Despite having just heard Jesus' prediction of the death that awaits him, James and John still dare to ask to have privileged seats when Jesus enters into his glory. Over and over, Jesus teaches his disciples that true greatness lies not in power, prestige or authority but in the humble service one can offer to another. This lesson is difficult to learn and it seems like Jesus' disciples of all times and ages need constant reminders.

When word of James and John's request causes trouble among the Twelve, Jesus warns his disciples that they have embarked on a new path – they are not like the Gentile rulers who lord it over their subjects, to "make their authority over them felt." Instead, Jesus invites them to take their ambition for greatness and turn that energy into service. This is the way of the Son of Man, who "did not come to be served, but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many."

**Questions for the week**: Jesus tells his disciples "The Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve." Who is a model of Christian servanthood in your life?

Please join us in keeping our Confirmation candidates in prayer as they prepare to receive an outpouring of the Holy Spirit!




