#### EASTER SUNDAY - RESURRECTION OF THE LORD

#### First Reading: Acts 10:34a, 37-43

In this passage, Peter testifies that he and his followers saw the miracles performed by Christ, witnessed His death, and believe in His resurrection. Now they will proclaim to all that Christ is the Son of God.

#### Second Reading: Colossians 3:1-4

Paul tells the Colossians that they will appear with Christ in glory. They should be mindful of things above rather than things on earth.

#### Gospel: John 20:1-9

In vivid detail, John tells us that when Mary Magdalene visited Christ's tomb, the tomb was empty. She told the apostles, who ran to the tomb, and saw the "wrappings" on the ground. The disciple who entered first "saw and believed."

## A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS **HIS WORD TODAY** by Rev. William J. Reilly

"This man God raised on the third day and granted that he be visible, not to all the people but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commissioned us to preach to the people, and testify that he is the one appointed by God to judge the living and the dead. To him all the prophets bear witness that everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins though his name."

The resurrection accounts of Jesus' appearances, following the empty tomb scene, are familiar and the source of hope and joy. The words of Peter in the sermon from the Acts of the Apostles, brings the meaning of His resurrection to us in 2017. Jesus' redeeming sacrifice earns forgiveness and new life for us today.

Remember, this is the same Peter who shortly before denied knowing the Lord because of fear and intimidation. This sermon of Peter, and others he spoke, as did Paul, summon us to let Easter speak to us today. The Risen Lord offers us the gift of new life, won at Calvary, and generously given if we sincerely turn to Him.

May we let the grace of this day bring the richness of God's grace to us all.





## EASTER JOY, THE EMPTY TOMB, OUR NEW LIFE, OUR VOCATION

"This is the Day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad!"

For over 2,000 years the followers of the Risen Christ have celebrated this day as the day Jesus rose from the dead as he promised. The faithful women went to his tomb, early in the morning of 'That First Day of the Week,' and found his tomb empty! They ran back to the upper room, where the disciples were locked away in fear of their own lives. They proclaimed that they had not only seen the empty tomb, but that some of them had even encountered the Risen Lord himself!

The disciples were hesitant to believe until Jesus appeared to them over the course of weeks until he returned to his heavenly Father. Then filled with the promised gift of the Holy Spirit, they went out to 'all the world,' as he instructed them to, proclaiming with their very lives his gospel Good News.

This is 'Our Day,' that the Lord has made for us. This is our Day of New life and Resurrection. We are his current-day witnesses at the empty tomb and his disciples of that Good News. So how are you and I dealing with that, living with that truly good news, in a world so full of bad news? Jesus' life, death and resurrection changed and continues to change our lives and the world.

Our faith journey extends beyond forty days of Lent and now fifty days of Easter. This is our lifelong mission, to go beyond the cross to the empty tomb, to be faithful here and now in all that we say, live and do. For this is the day the Lord has made, made for us. Let us rejoice and be glad to live it every day of our lives; for: *CHRIST IS RISEN! HE IS RISEN INDEED, ALLELUIA!*

Devotion to Jesus' Divine Mercy is based upon private revelations to St. Faustina, a Polish nun, to whom Our Lord reveled the remedy of His Love, God's love, for a world so

in need of God's love and mercy: For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son. St. Pope John-Paul II, who canonized Sr. Faustina and himself has been canonized, declared a saint, established the Second Sunday of Easter as DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY.

We will celebrate this event of our faith with prayerful devotion, Sunday, April 23<sup>rd</sup> is Divine Mercy Sunday. In preparation for this day, it is written in the diary of St. Faustina that a nine-day novena be said prior to Divine Mercy Sunday. The novena should be started on Good Friday. JANUARY, FEBRUARY AND MARCH WERE BUSY MONTHS AT OUR PANTRY. OVER 584 FAMILIES RECEIVED FOOD FROM OUR PANTRY DURING THESE MONTHS. OUR MONTHLY MASS DISTRIBUTIONS HAVE STARTED UP AGAIN. WE SERVE AS A DISTRIBUTION SITE FOR THESE MONTHLY DELIVERIES. WE HAVE 6 TO 10 NEIGHBORING PANTRIES PARTICIPATING IN THESE MASS DISTRIBUTIONS.

WE WOULD LIKE TO THANK STEWART'S "HOLIDAY MATCH PROGRAM" FOR PROVIDING OUR PANTRY WITH \$1500 TO BE USED DURING THE SUMMER MONTHS TO HELP CLIENTS WITH CHILDREN. THESE CHILDREN ARE ELIGIBLE FOR FREE BREAKFASTS AND LUNCHES DURING THE SCHOOL YEAR. THE STEWART'S GRANT HELPS US PROVIDE THEM WITH ADDITIONAL FOOD DURING THE SUMMER MONTHS OF JULY AND AUGUST WHEN SCHOOL IS NOT IN SESSION.

WE'RE ALWAYS LOOKING FOR MORE PANTRY VOLUNTEERS. IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO HELP, PLEASE CONTACT US AND WE'LL ARRANGE TO MEET WITH YOU AND DISCUSS THE MANY WAYS IN WHICH YOU CAN HELP OUR PANTRY.
