## TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

### First Reading: Isaiah 45:1, 4-6

Cyrus, King of Persia and friend to the Jewish people, becomes the Lord's anointed one, and through God's intervention, returns the Jews to their own country.

### Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 1:1-5b

Paul rejoices that the Thessalonians, newly converted to Christianity, are displaying remarkable constancy in their new-found faith.

### Gospel: Matthew 22:15-21

Seeking to entrap Jesus in his speech, the hostile and hypocritical Pharisees ask him this dangerous question, "Is it lawful to pay tax to the emperor or not?" Realizing their treacherous motives, Jesus asks for a Roman coin, and pointing to the inscription of Caesar's, he answers, "Give to Caesar what is Caesar's, but give to God what is God's."

### A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

**"We give thanks to God always for all of you, remembering you in our prayers, unceasingly calling to mind your work of faith and labor of love, and enduring hope in our Lord Jesus Christ before our God and Father, knowing brothers and sisters loved by God how you were chosen. For our gospel did not come to you in word alone, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with much conviction."**

Paul with his companions wrote this letter to give praise to God and encouragement to the disciples at Thessalonica. As I reread this inspired message, I can put a name and face of people of our time to whom a similar writing could be addressed.

I consider persons of great faith who have walked among us, as St. Teresa of Calcutta. I hear the words calling for justice spoken by the martyred Oscar Romero in his labor of love. I reflect on the word of hope generated by the exhortation of Pope Francis in the 'Joy of the Gospel.'

Their example reminds me that I too have been chosen. More than just the written word, these models remind me that I have been chosen and the power of the gospel and Spirit lives within me. The fruit of the reflection calls me to live the same message with deeper conviction for 'I am the Lord, there is no other.'

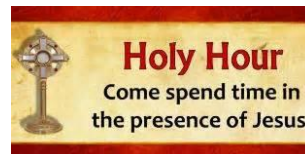

FROM JUNE 22<sup>ND</sup> TO SEPTEMBER 14<sup>TH</sup> WE GAVE ADDITIONAL BREAKFAST & LUNCH FOOD ITEMS TO EACH CHILD. THIS WAS MADE POSSIBLE THANKS TO THE STEWART'S HOLIDAY MATCH GRANT. MOST OF OUR CHILDREN RECEIVE FREE BREAKFAST AND LUNCH AT SCHOOL, BUT WHAT HAPPENS DURING THE SUMMER BREAK? STEWART'S GAVE US \$1500 TO HELP WITH ADDITIONAL FOOD FOR THESE CHILDREN. A BIG "THANK YOU" GOES OUT TO STEWART'S!!!!

WE ALREADY HAVE 69 FAMILIES REGISTERED FOR OUR THANKSGIVING FOOD BASKETS. WITH TWO MORE WEEKS OF REGISTRATION REMAINING, WE WILL DEFINITELY SURPASS LAST YEAR'S TOTAL OF 80 FAMILIES.
