During the opening Friday night Adoration session of our recent trip to Steubenville, I felt a great need for our country to return to God. America needs to find our identity in Christ so we know who we are. I told God to use me, and then I felt God telling me my future husband needed my prayers right then and there. Whoever he is, God told me to pray for him. As I continued to pray, He then told me that one of my future grandsons would go through great hardship and that he would need to trust in God, but in the end he would experience great peace and joy. I felt God asking me if I would give Him my family and entrust them to Him, and I told Him to have them. I told Him my future family is His – He loves them more than I can, He knows what they need more than I ever will and He can protect them better than I can; I don't even know them yet, but I told Him they are His. God then looked right at me in that moment and said, "And so are you. You are Mine. Right now, in this moment, you are Mine." I felt Him pull me into His embrace and I received the refuge I needed. I know this is what I need to seek whenever I'm frustrated or need help. God then told me He understands me. I know there will be times in the future where I wish people would understand me, but I don't need them to because the King of the universe understands me, and He listens. As Adoration continued, my hands, feet and mouth would oftentimes tremble and tingle - I asked God why, and He told me it's because He wants me to be His hands, feet and mouth here on Earth.

As the priest began to process with the Blessed Sacrament throughout the room and as he came our way, I immediately jumped up and my whole body was overcome with trembling. My arms were outstretched in prayer, but suddenly became heavy. Before I lowered them, I felt God say, "Keep them up, stay strong. I'll need you to be strong for My children. Don't worry, I'll be your strength, but I need you to be strong." I responded out loud, "I want to be bold for You! I want to be strong for You! I want You to use me! Mama Mary, help me say yes to your Son! Help me choose your Son! St. Joseph, give me your steadfast devotion! Mary and Joseph, give me your courageous humility! Holy family, give me strength and guide me!"

As Friday night Adoration came to an end, I knew in my heart God had chosen me that night. Steubenville hosted another large Adoration session the following night, and this time around, I wanted to choose Him. As music played and we all worshipped, I began to sway on my feet and had very little control of my body. God then said to me, "I am your foundation and you will not fall, but if you did I would knock you down and catch you."

My body became completely paralyzed once I sat down and I couldn't move anything except my eyes, and was reminded of the paralytic from the Bible before Jesus healed him. I tried to move my legs but couldn't, and then felt God say, "There's a reason I'm doing this to you. We both know you're always nonstop go-go-go, but you need to make time to sit still and be silent with Me. I'm forcing you to right now, but you need to remember to choose it."

To the Moon and Back Ministry offers compassionate, Christcentered support in both group and individual settings for anyone who has experienced miscarriage, stillbirth, infant death, infertility, failed adoption, or being childless not by choice. This ministry hopes to reach those grieving from a loss that is often not seen, recognized, or even known to others. We encourage couples to honor their dreams for children including children gone but never forgotten. Compassion begets compassion, and our goal is to ensure nobody feels alone in their grief for a loss so common yet so unspoken. - We can schedule one year out from the date we are contacted. We do not go beyond a year so if someone passes away they have that date for their 1 year anniversary. At this time we are only able to schedule 1 Mass per intention a year.
- Those scheduling wedding anniversaries, 50, 55, 60, 65 years or more are encouraged to schedule their Mass as far ahead as possible and will not be held to the 1 year restriction.
