Resting in the Holy Spirit

Saturday nights at Steubenville are famous for their Eucharistic Adoration, because it is a very powerful experience where many people have intense encounters with Jesus. I had been looking forward to this moment, until I went to confession beforehand. The priest had said something that didn't sit right with me, and it made me feel down. I talked to a group leader right before we went to Adoration, but it didn't calm me. My heart was heavy, and I couldn't keep myself from crying. I was filled with devastation — all I wanted was for God to fix it, so I told Him what was on my heart. The music then began playing as Adoration started, and it's such a powerful moment — the band plays as Jesus is brought in, and you are surrounded with hundreds of kids your age, singing along with their hands outstretched, praising God.

I stood there with my hands out and repeated the phrase "Come Holy Spirit, come now, come as you wish." I watched as the Blessed Sacrament passed down our aisle and I could feel myself shaking, specifically my right hand. I wondered – "Is this my doing or the Holy Spirit's?" I believe I was in this state for a little bit, but the next thing I remember was my weight shifting forward and falling to the ground. It was a very weird state to be in because I couldn't move, but I still knew where I was and that the group leaders were praying over me. When I was first being prayed over, I actually started screaming and couldn't do anything about it until a group leader said, "God, take away her fears." My screams subsided to chattering teeth before turning into absolute stillness. I noticed I was still mumbling the Holy Spirit prayer, and stopped saying it because the Holy Spirit was definitely present.

I asked God to reveal to me what He wanted to show me, and He then showed me two different settings. One had complete darkness and golden rings coming in and out of focus, where I could hear His voice. The second was under a willow tree with God, Jesus and Mary. The first thing I heard God say to me was, "Thank you." He thanked me for giving my heart and body completely to Him. He said it isn't an easy thing to do because it requires so much trust. Since I fully trusted Him with myself, He told me I would be blessed in the future since He would be the one guiding me.

At this point, I could feel again and was aware of how God was in my body and controlling it. God said, "Much like how My grace will bring My children back to Me, you will help bring them back to Me as well." He then started talking about college, which has been a major concern on my mind. God asked me, "Why are you giving your future so much control over your life? It is the one thing you think about constantly, and you are giving it more importance than Me. Don't worry about what school to go to. It is My job to worry about it, not yours. Instead, live your life in the present moment and enjoy it. When the time is right, I will reveal to you and guide you to where you are meant to go."

A paramedic then came to check on me. I was told to open my eyes and they sat me in a chair. It was such a peaceful state, being in God's control. When I was fully out of resting in the Holy Spirit, it felt like my whole encounter had been 15 minutes long, but in reality, 2.5 hours had passed.


