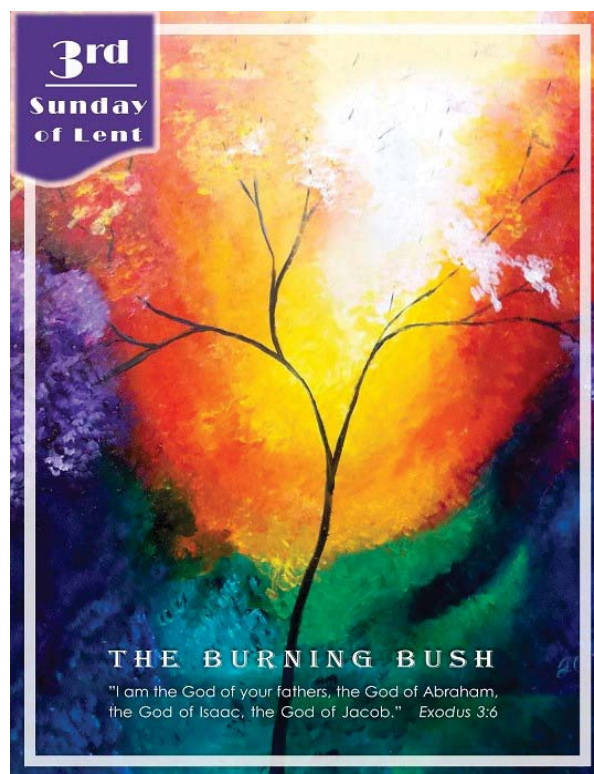

From Your Pastor

Jesus' parables often have surprising endings and the one in today's gospel about the barren fig tree does not disappoint. Why would anyone waste their time, space, effort and fertilizer on a tree that has not borne fruit for three years? It would be best to cut it down and start over with a new tree. For us humans this approach makes the most sense, but this is not so with God. God, in the words of Jesus, invites us, again and again, to life with him and to participate in building up his kingdom. The fig tree in the parable was not thrown away and neither are we. This is important to remember in the way we treat those around us. Like any tree or plant, people grow and blossom in their own time and at their own pace. On our part this requires patience, a virtue that is not highly cultivated in our society. How often do we want immediate answers without any interruptions, inconveniences and irritations? We look for the perfect person and the ideal relationship. If this does not happen quickly, then we abandon the effort and consider the time, endurance and steadiness to build such a relationship as a waste of our time. Practicing patience implies that we are willing to bear suffering, endure delays and persevere when growing the relationship seems slow and difficult. Taking a moment or two to turn to Jesus in prayer may help us to be more patient in our lives with people who are struggling as Jesus is patient with us.

LENTEN QUIET EVENING: On Tuesday evening, April 5th, from 6:30-8:00 P.M. we will have a Lenten evening of prayer & reflection in church. This will be an opportunity to go to confession and receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We encourage you to take this opportunity to do so.

COLLECTION FOR THE PEOPLE OF UKRAINE:

There is a collection offering box by the side doorway of the church (closest to the sacristy) for monetary offerings for the people of Ukraine. In the spirit of the Lenten practice of almsgiving, this offering box will remain by this doorway for the duration of the Lenten season. Knowing the outpouring of generosity that our parish is known for, I am sure that you will be as generous as possible in assisting these people who are the victims of such a horrible aggression.

3rd Sunday of Lent

During recess time at the parish grade school, one young boy was accused of cheating because he did not admit he had been tagged. A few minutes later, he tripped and scraped his knee on the pavement. As the tears welled up in his eyes, one of his companions offered a theological explanation for the painful mishap. "God made you trip because he doesn't like cheaters!" If this were indeed a doctrine of faith, we'd all be limping for life!

When bad things happen, people like to know why. The people assume that those who died in Siloam or Galilee were the worst of sinners and their sin was the cause of their suffering. Jesus refutes this notion, and reminds them that without reforming, evil will remain with them and they too will perish. But there is hope. Everyone is given another chance to reform, just like the fruitless fig tree. But without real change, there will be no life.

Lent is the time to take advantage of another chance God gives us to reform our lives. God offers everyone the chance to accept His grace, to be forgiven and to grow in holiness. No sin is too great and no person is beyond hope. Just ask, and all that you need will be given to you.

Henri Nouwen Speaks to us through his Letters

Henri writes to a reader who is struggling with his faith. (taken from "Love, Henri: Letters on the Spiritual Life"):

Dear Bill,

...I have just recently been reflecting in a new way on the story of the disciples who went to Emmaus, and I wonder if your 'loss of faith' is not in some way similar to theirs. We often have to rediscover Jesus Christ in a whole new way, a more interior and a more spiritual way. I have been struck by the fact that when they recognized Jesus in the 'breaking of the bread' he disappeared before their eyes, so there is a deep connection between recognizing and disappearing, between presence and absence, between knowing and not knowing. I wonder if for those who really leave the spiritual life there is not a real crisis to be faced that comes about in the later years. It is a crisis of a second loneliness, a loneliness we should not try to get rid of, which is the place where we can rediscover Jesus. Not the Jesus who we knew in the past but the spirit of Jesus who can really fill our hearts and senses and help us to live in the midst of our mad world..."

Why the Ancient Traditions of Prayer, Fasting & Almsgiving during Lent?

In preparation for the great celebration of Easter, we are called to pray, fast and give alms as some of the ways to help us draw closer to God during Lent.

Prayer is one of the ways to connect with God, in silence, in words, and in worship. Jesus prayed constantly and taught us to pray to Our Father in heaven. Jesus emphasized that our prayer need not be long, complicated or showy, but rather, short, to the point, and heartfelt.

Fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, (taking only one full meal) reminds us of our dependence on God. We "do not live on bread alone."

On the Fridays of Lent we remember the sacrifice of Christ on Good Friday and unite ourselves with that sacrifice through abstinence from meat. These are acts of self-discipline and self-control which can help to keep us mindful of God's loving presence.

Almsgiving: Lent invites us to see the face of Christ in the hungry and homeless, sick and suffering. Jesus depends on us to listen with compassion to the joys and sorrows of our friends and family members and to reach out in kindness and compassion to all. Imagine with me as God has created these wonderful fig trees. He has assigned his only Son to be the teacher to instruct about these fruitful trees. Let's view this fig tree in a field full of fig trees and call this the Garden of Communion, Participation and Mission. View each of the trees as a representing Parish in the world. The laity become the soil under the fig trees. The soil losing nutrients and energy from a two year drought. However the teacher knows there was change in the soil before the drought.
