



James Martin Speaks to us through his "Essential Writings"

Many Catholics were shocked to discover in 2007 that St. Teresa of Calcutta had spent much of her life experiencing a profound alienation from God. In These excerpts (Part VII and Conclusion) from a James Martin essay that appeared in the March 17, 2008 issue of America magazine, he talks about the "seven D's" - darkness, dryness, desolation, doubt, disbelief, depression and despair: "What are these states? How do they affect our relationship with God?... One need not be a scholar of Christian spirituality, a spiritual director or a person under spiritual direction to see that disentangling these spiritual strands can be encouraging, clarifying, consoling and freeing. Understanding that most of these experiences are common can encourage us by reducing anxiety... Being able to bring such experiences to prayer can be consoling, since it can deepen our relationship with God, in the same way that speaking about a thorny problem with a friend can strengthen a friendship and lead to greater intimacy...Knowing that these experiences can lead us to God can free us from fear, which can cripple our spiritual lives. For the God by whom Jesus felt abandoned on the cross is the same God who delivered Jesus from death, giving him new life."

Among the saints honored during the month of September (on September 23) is St. Pius of Pietrelcina, popularly known as Padre Pio. Padre Pio is a modern" saint. He died on September 23, 1968 at the age of 81. He developed a well-earned reputation for his exceptional manner in the confessional. And he is modern enough that some of our own contemporaries had the privilege of going to confession to Padre Pio while vacationing in Italy. Born Francesco Forgione to a poor Italian family. Padre Pio described himself as "a poor brother who prays." In 1948, Padre Pio heard the confession of Karol Wojtyla, the future Pope (and Saint) John Paul II. On June 16, 2002, Pope John Paul II canonized Padre Pio, noting, among other things, that "his body, marked by the 'stigmata,' showed the intimate connection between death and resurrection." May our devotion to St. Padre Pio increase our dedication to the Sacrament of Penance and increase our faith in the resurrection.
