

This information is being given to you now so that you can mark your calendars. More information about Thiago's diaconate ordination and Mass of Thanksgiving will follow in the coming weeks.

The biblical definition of a prophet is one who interprets the divine will. A prophet by this definition is one who delivers God's message to his or her contemporaries and advocates for adherence to God's plan. In this way we see the Church as being prophetic. 



Henri sends a third letter to a couple who have asked him to preside at their upcoming wedding (taken from "Love, Henri: Letters on the Spiritual Life"):




Dear Jim and Cindy,

It speaks of life where there is death and of hope where there is despair..."

4th Sunday in Ordinary Time

What good is a great story unless someone tells it? What's a wonderful song unless someone sings it? How can an idea change the world unless someone makes it work? Ideas, songs and stories all need to be put into practice so their value will be seen, heard and known.

Jesus confronts and rebukes evil and then banishes it. People were amazed and began to ask the basic question of faith "who is this man?" The answer leads to a choice, sometimes called the leap of faith; is Jesus the Messiah? If the answer is yes, life is never the same.

Faith is not just a good idea. It must be lived and expressed, preached and accepted, taught and understood. 
PIETA
