

# From Your Pastor

## **Family Shelter Needs**

The Interfaith Hospitality Family Shelter on June Street is starting the new year in need of our help. They have 2 open weeks this month with no congregation hosting - January 8 through the 21st. Emails have gone out asking for parishes to chip in.

Our parish has signed up for two over-nights and an evening shift. The families are able to cook for themselves but **grocery cards are needed** so that they can shop for the food to feed everyone.

As many of you know, these cards are available after Mass in the church hall - ask for Sue and Dave. Big Y is the store closest to the shelter.

Household supplies are also needed: **Toilet paper**, paper towels, napkins, dish washing liquid, hand soap and laundry soap needs are at each church exit. These can be left in the Parish Outreach area. Many thanks for your help on such short notice.

The cold weather is upon us and the homeless of our city wait in line for shelter in the only city shelter available. The numbers of homeless has grown to more than double the number of beds in that shelter.

A donation of gloves, a hat, or socks would be put to good use. There is a bin in the Outreach Collection area. Many thanks to the Prayer Shawl Ministry for their prayers and donation of scarves.

Many thanks to Donna Warner as well. Donna spent endless hours knitting scarves for the homeless! Donna's kindness now adds peace and warmth to the hearts of many who live desperate, cold and lonely lives, in the chaotic world of homelessness.

#### THE FAMILY CONNECTION

January 9th is the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Mark the dates of each family member's baptism on the calendar and plan to celebrate baptism days this year. 


Youth ministry is a faith based group focused on achieving a personal relationship with God through service, music minis try and group activities.
