

We become the instruments of grace and faith.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Many dioceses here in the United States face challenges due to priest shortages, lack of funds, remote geography, or impoverished parishes. #### I.H.N. Family Shelter Needs

Massachusetts is the only state in the nation that guarantees shelter to families and their children. Currently there are 3,395 homeless families living in shelters in our state. I.H.N. is one of the shelters that provides training and support services to help families to secure jobs with fair wages as well as permeant and safe housing.

Our parish is one of 30 congregations that assists homeless families through the Interfaith Hospitality Network (I.N.H.) shelter on June Street in Worcester. Thanks to your generosity we are able to assist with staffing and supply needs.

Many thanks to Clara Dewar, one of our young adults, who joined in the effort by working with the children and helping with homework.

The need for grocery cards continues. In this way the families can plan, shop and cook their own meals. As many of you know, these cards are available after Mass in the church hall - ask for Sue and Dave. Big Y is the store closest to the shelter.

Household supply needs continue so these have been posted at each church exit. Supplies can be left in the Parish Outreach area.

#### Mustard Seed needs scarves, socks and food


Last week our parish served the evening meal to the guests at the Mustard Seed. Thanks to all who helped out! Special thanks to Bob McCrohon for cooking the meal.
