From Your Pastor

By now our annual Lenten brochure should have arrived at your home. If you did not receive one, there are extra copies of it available at the doorways of the church. Lent will begin this Wednesday, March 1st, (Ash Wednesday) with the blessing and distribution of ashes at the 8:00 A.M., 12:10 and 6:30 P.M. Masses.

In my 43 years of priesthood, I have witnessed the personal prayer life of many good and faithful parishioners demonstrated in personal devotions prayed either before or after Mass, especially during the week. These devotions have usually been of 15-20 minutes in duration to allow people some personal quiet time in prayer as well. This is a good practice to keep in mind as we enter the Lenten season, so beginning on Ash Wednesday, March 1st, there will be one devotion, either the Rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet, that will be prayed between the time of 7:25-7:45 A.M. before Weekday Mass. I believe that this devotional practice will allow everyone to be properly prepared and disposed to celebrate and participate in the sacred mysteries of the Mass.

This Lenten season, as has been true in recent years, Bishop McManus is strongly encouraging every Catholic in our diocese to take the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation even if a person has not received this sacrament (or gone to confession) for a long time. I would wholeheartedly urge you to take this opportunity to receive this sacrament during this time. In addition to the scheduled times for receiving the sacrament on Saturday afternoons (3:00-3:30) during Lent, the opportunity to receive this sacrament will be offered on Tuesday evenings during Lent from 7:00-7:30 P.M as well as on Saturday evenings from 5:00-5:30 P.M.

If several more St. George families begin to use "caring cards" to buy their weekly groceries, we might be able to help even more families to move from a shelter to a new home.

At the IHN shelter we have seen the faces of the children in these families and we know the stress that life in a shelter puts on parents and the little ones. Please pray for them and continue to be as generous as you always are.

A Letter from Bishop Mc Manus

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

For over 50 years, the **Collection for the Church in Latin America** has been a sign of the solidarity of the Church in the United States with the Church in Latin America and the Caribbean. For people living in these regions, barriers to practicing the faith include lack of resources, shortages of pastoral ministers, and poor infrastructures that make relatively simple things like participating in weekly Mass difficult. Your support of the collection helps to share the faith with those who long to experience God's mercy within strong faith communities.

For example, in northern Peru, great distances and deteriorated roads mean that clergy must often travel by foot or mule to rural communities. As a result, some communities are visited by priests and ministers only once per month, many just twice per year. The Collection for the Church in Latin America was able to help fund training for 65 pastoral ministers for the communities in this region. Because of your support, these new leaders continue to reach out and serve the rural communities, ensuring that all feel included in our family of faith.

The Collection for the Church in Latin America, through projects like these, empowers the faithful of Latin America and the Caribbean to deepen their faith and share it with each other and the world. A significant portion of this collection is also used to assist in the ongoing efforts of our own **Diocesan Hispanic**Ministry, which serves the large number of Hispanic and Latino Catholics who are now in the Diocese of Worcester. It is gratifying to see the life of faith flourishing in these parish communities as their faith life enriches us all.

I encourage you to respond to the theme to "Share your Faith" by supporting the special Collection for the Church in Latin America in our parishes on the weekend of March 5.
