

Letter from Bishop Mc Manus

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Many dioceses here in the United States face challenges due to priest shortages, lack of funds, remote geography, or impoverished parishes. The Catholic Home Missions Appeal supports these dioceses that struggle to make ends meet and to serve the many needs of their parishioners. Home mission dioceses are those dioceses in the United States, its territories, and former territories that cannot provide basic pastoral services to Catholics without outside help. Basic pastoral services include Mass and the other sacraments, religious education, and ministry training for priests, deacons, religious sisters, and lay people. Right now, over 40% of dioceses are considered home mission. Thanks to your generosity, these dioceses were assisted with nearly \$10 million in assistance in 2019.

American Samoa, an archipelago of seven islands in the South Pacific and the only United States territory south of the equator, is located over 500 miles closer to New Zealand than it is to Hawaii. Over 97% of the territory's population lives on the largest Island. Tutuila, leaving the small number of residents in the outlying Manu'a islands to be served by one catechist and one priest, who visits monthly to celebrate Mass and to bring sacraments to the faithful. Despite these limited resources, the residents of Manu'a are growing in faith, with more becoming interested in being baptized and welcomed into the Church.

Your generosity has helped sustain this invaluable ministry to the faithful in the isolated environment of the Diocese of Samoa-Pago Pago. By supporting the Catholic Home Missions Appeal (CHMA), you continue a tradition of support for mission dioceses in the United States dating back to 1924. I encourage you to be generous on the weekend of February 2 to help strengthen the Church at home. Your support will truly make a difference. From Your Pastor

The Blessing of Throats will take place after all Masses this weekend, February 1-2.

Today we celebrate the Presentation of our Lord in the Temple. This feast may seem to us to be out of context with the time of the year that we observe in our liturgical calendar since we are already two weeks into what we refer to as Ordinary Time. However, according to the Law of Moses, in Jesus' time a male child had to be presented in the temple for a purification rite 40 days after birth, and today is 40 days, inclusive, after Christmas. An appropriate offering of either a one-year old lamb if a family could afford it or two turtle doves or young pigeons if they could not, was made at the time of this ritual. Its symbolism should not be lost on us for in bringing Jesus to the Temple, his parents are giving back the very gift that God has given to them. This gesture of whole-hearted thanksgiving to God becomes the pattern of salvation and the way of all Christian living. While we Christians are no longer dedicated according to the Law of Moses, we are presented at Baptism, by name, and through the grace of this sacrament are conformed to the very identity and sacrifice that Jesus ultimately made for us. The life that God has given to us is therefore best lived (offered up) by our own loving, thankful and obedient service to God.

This Monday evening, February 3rd, we will hold another session of our Bible Study, entitled Sip, Snack and Scripture. This Bible Study will take place in the church hall from 7:00 – 8:30 P.M. On that night we will focus on the theme of the temptations of Jesus in the desert as told in the Gospels of Mark, Matthew and Luke. All are welcome to attend.

Within four weeks we will be entering the season of Lent, and soon our Lenten brochure should be arriving at your home. All Lenten information as well as the liturgies and services for Holy Week and Easter will be included in that brochure.

From Father Nally:

ANNIVERSARY OF ROE V. WADE: JANUARY 2020

On January 22, 1973, the Supreme Court legalized abortion throughout the United States in its companion decisions Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton. Since that time, millions of children have lost their lives and millions of women and families have been wounded by abortion.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), no. 373 designates January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children."

As individuals, we are called to observe this day through the penitential practices of prayer, fasting and/or almsgiving. The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops provides resources to help parishes, schools, families, ministries, and individual Catholics participate in this important day of prayer and penance.

In addition, the USCCB also sponsors an annual nationwide novena called "9 Days for Life," which surrounds the liturgical observance of the Day of Prayer. Each day for nine days, a different intention is featured, accompanied by a short reflection, suggested actions, and related information as we pray for the respect and protection of every human life. In 2020, the novena is took place Tuesday, January 21 - Wednesday, January 29.

A sample timeline and activity, homily helps, announcements, and more are provided to help you get started. You are encouraged to adapt these resources as needed to fit your specific parish, school, or ministry.

Blessing of Throats - St. Blaise This weekend February 1st and 2nd

Saint Blaise was the bishop in Armenia during the fourth century. Very little is known about his life. According to various accounts he was a physician before becoming a bishop. He was reputed to have miraculously cured a little boy who nearly died because of a fishbone in his throat. From the eighth century he has been invoked on behalf of the sick, especially those afflicted with illnesses of the throat. During the Blessing of Throats, the following words are said: "Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."
