

From Your Pastor

As we approach the halfway point in our Lenten season, we are reminded this weekend that we humans have a tendency to choose what is easier but may not necessarily be the better option. What is easier too often takes us away from God and toward the darkness of sin. God sent his Son into the world to be a light for us. That light illumines the path for us to be his disciples, thereby allowing us to let go of preferences and actions that keep us in the dark. We can then embark on a path which leads us to goodness and truth. In the first reading God's people fail to listen to the prophets and repent which results in their ruin and exile to Babylon. In the second reading St. Paul tells the Ephesians that they have been saved by the grace of God (a gift) through faith. In the Gospel Jesus tells Nicodemus that God has sent his Son into the world, not to condemn it, but to heal and save it. This saving and healing act of God is the light which continually shines through the darkness of the world around us.

LENTEN QUIET EVENING: On Tuesday evening, March 23rd, from 6:30-8:00 P.M. we will have a Lenten evening of prayer & reflection in church. This will be an opportunity to go to confession and receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We encourage you to take this opportunity to do so.

<u>Virtual Faith-Sharing for Men:</u> Over a year ago, Fr. Nally, when he was our senior priest, began a faith-sharing group for men during Advent (2019) and Lent (2020) before the COVID-19 pandemic struck. Fast and Abstinence Guidelines

Lenten fast and abstinence regulations from the Diocese of Worcester are as follows:

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics fourteen (14) and older on Good Friday and all Fridays of Lent.

Fasting is to be observed by all Catholics 18 years of age but not yet 59 years of age on Good Friday.

Those who are bound to fast may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's need, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed Lenten penitential practices.

Why not join us for Lent this year?


The Rosary and the Divine Mercy Chaplet is prayed during this time. This is a wonderful opportunity to learn to pray the Rosary.

Pray . Fast . give

Why the Ancient Traditions of Prayer, Fasting & Almsgiving during Lent?

In preparation for the great celebration of Easter, we are called to pray, fast and give alms as some of the ways to help us draw closer to God during Lent.

<u>Prayer</u> is one of the ways to connect with God, in silence, in words, and in worship. Jesus prayed constantly and taught us to pray to Our Father in heaven. Jesus emphasized that our prayer need not be long, complicated or showy, but rather, short, to the point, and heartfelt.

<u>Fasting</u> on Good Friday, (taking only one full meal) reminds us of our dependence on God. We "do not live on bread alone."

On the Fridays of Lent we remember the sacrifice of Christ on Good Friday and unite ourselves with that sacrifice through abstinence from meat. These are acts of self-discipline and self-control which can help to keep us mindful of God's loving presence.

Almsgiving; Lent invites us to see the face of Christ in the hungry and homeless, sick and suffering. Jesus depends on us to listen with compassion to the joys and sorrows of our friends and family members and to reach out in kindness and compassion to all. <u>Henri Nouwen Speaks to us</u> <u>through his Letters</u>


Henri writes to a good friend who has lost his partner to heart disease. (taken from "Love, Henri: Letters on the Spiritual Life"):

Beloved Piet.

"... Love is stronger than death. You know it and I know it. But I pray for you that this knowledge will descend deeper and deeper into your heart and bear fruit there. I feel your sorrow, your moments of deep loneliness...I also feel that strange love of God that envelops you, a joy that is hidden in sorrow. Jesus spoke those mysterious words: 'It is best for you that I leave you now...so that my Spirit, the consoler, can come.' I will continue to pray for you that Frederik's life, but also his death, might bring you closer to God, the consoler ..."



Interfaith Hospitality Network (IHN) Brief History and an Update from Michael Ohl

As many of you know, St. George Parish is a Charter Member of the Interfaith Hospitality Network of Greater Worcester. Our parish community, along with 28 other local congregations and synagogues, supports the work of providing shelter for homeless families in crisis. Our involvement with IHN began more than 15 years ago through the ecumenical work of our then pastor, Fr. Henry Donoghue. In 2012 a permanent home to provide shelter for homeless families was purchased on June Street here in Worcester. Our parishioners continue to help keep the shelter going by providing year round financial and volunteer support. Each spring our parish provides a week of staffing, donating meals, gardening, painting and more. As you might guess, the work of caring for the property and buildings is essential and ongoing. Our parishioner Michael Ohl who has been volunteering on the "House Committee" at INH for the past several months. Here is what Mike has to say about his service:

"There is always something new to do (and someone new to meet) at IHN. After successfully addressing code issues (basement reorganization, attic cleanout, replace rotted basement steps, improved front entrance lighting) and "routine" home repairs (broken window, broken horsehair plaster wall, removal of old/unused boiler, etc.), attention is now shifting to longer term plans. Future projects include window replacement and repair/repainting of the many guest rooms. Stay tuned for opportunities to help in terms of time, talent or treasure."

We are so grateful to Mike for his good work! We look forward to pandemic restrictions lifting so that many of us can join him more fully at IHN.

St. George's supports the Loaves and Fishes Food Pantry at the Unitarian Universalist Church (UUCW) on Holden Street with a portion of its generous food donations every month. The pantry provides food to approximately 65 needy families in the area. UUCW is very thankful that St George's provides for this cause. UUCW also receives food from their parishioners, other organizations and purchases several items in bulk from the Worcester County Food Bank. On the third Friday evening of each month, St. George food donations are delivered to UUCW. About 10 volunteers from the UUCW, St George's and other organizations bag groceries consisting of juices, milk, pasta and sauce, soup, canned fruits and vegetables, peanut butter, tuna and canned chicken. dry fruit, nuts, applesauce, rice, cereals and miscellaneous snacks. Fresh fruits and vegetables, eggs, bread and Table Talk pies are also provided. Distribution to needy families occurs the following morning and is managed by the Loaves and Fishes administration. Since March of 2020, the volunteer count has been limited to no more than 10 people. Thank you to the Messier and Lubiwicki families for their monthly commitment (pre Covid) and we are looking forward to a return to a normal operation in the coming months, allowing for more volunteers. 
