

Letter from Bishop McManus

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

For more than a half century, the **Collection for the Church in Latin America** has been a sign of the solidarity of the Church in the United States with the Church in Latin America and the Caribbean. The distance in rural areas and deteriorated roads make it difficult for some communities to have Mass regularly. Language barriers and lack of resources make catechetical materials difficult to produce.

Social justice issues are a constant challenge to living a life in faithful witness to our faith. For example, human captivity remains a real challenge throughout Latin America. Human trafficking in Brazil, for example, is a serious problem that takes numerous forms: forced rural labor that amounts to modern-day slavery, trafficking to support prostitution, and forced marriages. The Church in Brazil is addressing this challenge by training leaders to publicize and denounce trafficking practices and to work with all levels of government to combat human trafficking. By supporting the Collection for the Church in Latin America, you are helping Brazilians fulfill their Gospel call to protect the vulnerable, defend human life and dignity, and address the causes of human trafficking throughout the country.

The Collection for the Church in Latin America empowers the faithful of Latin America and the Caribbean to deepen their faith and share it with each other and the world. A significant portion of this collection is also used to assist in the ongoing efforts of our own **Diocesan Hispanic Ministry**, which serves the large number of Hispanic and Latino Catholics who are now in the Diocese of Worcester. It is gratifying to see the life of faith flourishing in these parish communities as their faith life enriches us all.

I encourage you to respond to the theme to "Share your Faith" by supporting the special Collection for the Church in Latin America when your parish takes up the collection. Please be assured of my appreciation for your generous response.

Lenten Regulations

Lenten fast and abstinence regulations form the Diocese of Worcester are as follows:

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics fourteen (14) and older on Good Friday and all Fridays of Lent.

Fasting is to be observed by all Catholics 18 years of age but not yet 59 years of age on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Those who are bound to fast may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's need, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed Lenten penitential practices.

Lent Begins this Week

Lent began on Ash Wednesday. Lent is the season of preparation for the resurrection of Jesus Christ on Easter Sunday.

The ashes were made by burning the blessed palms that were distributed the previous year on Palm Sunday. The distribution of ashes remind us of our own mortality and called us to repentance. The ashes remind us of our own sinfulness. They are a sign of our humility.

Why the Ancient Traditions of Prayer, Fasting & Almsgiving during Lent?

In preparation for the great celebration of Easter, we are called to pray, fast and give alms as some of the ways to help us draw closer to God during Lent.

<u>Prayer</u> is one of the ways to connect with God , in silence, in words, and in worship. Jesus prayed constantly and taught us to pray to Our Father in heaven. Jesus emphasized that our prayer need not be long, complicated or showy, but rather, short, to the point, and heartfelt.

<u>Fasting</u> on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, (taking only one full meal) reminds us of our dependence on God. We "do not live on bread alone."

On the Fridays of Lent we remember the sacrifice of Christ on Good Friday and unite ourselves with that sacrifice through abstinence from meat. These are acts of self-discipline and self-control which can help to keep us mindful of God's loving presence.

Almsgiving: Lent invites us to see the face of Christ in the hungry and homeless, sick and suffering. Jesus depends on us to listen with compassion to the joys and sorrows of our friends and family members and to reach out in kindness and compassion to all. They had called ahead for assurance that the Mustard Seed was still open. We waited a bit and before long the door bell rang. The young couple came in together, holding onto one another. She was coughing and wearing a hospital bracelet. "I have bronchitis," she said, "I've lost my inhaler and we haven't eaten all day! We gave them plates of food and offered warm clothing. They were grateful for all of it. They left arm in arm, bundled up against the cold winter night. They were going to walk about half a mile up the hill to spend the night in the city shelter. Chances are they would be too late for a bed. They would likely spend the night in the overflow area, sitting up in a chair.

From Father Nally: Take Action! Say No To Roe!!

A public hearing for the "Roe" bills (to Remove Obstacles and Expand abortion access) took place 6/17/2019 in the MA State House. The proposed legislation (Senate Bill 1209/House Bill 3320) is designed to dramatically expand abortion at the state level with virtually no limits – just like New York.
