From Your Pastor

This weekend we will be conducting our annual in-pew collection for the diocesan Partners in Charity appeal. ## Lenten Regulations



Lenten fast and abstinence regulations for the Diocese of Worcester are as follows.

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics fourteen (14) and older on Good Friday and all Fridays of Lent.

Fasting is to be observed by all Catholics 18 years of age but not yet 59 years of age on Good Friday.

Those who are bound to fast may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's need, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Our lives can be filled with so much! Yet God is present and speaks to

us always, especially at Mass. We hear it sometimes, but the clutter of life can cause us to miss it or forget. As a parish community we are invited to try something new at Mass.

Listen to the music, readings, preaching, prayers and to the silence in your own heart.

Ask God to help you hear just one word or idea, one challenge or invitation, that will help you to grow spiritually during the coming week.

Use the little booklet, which you will find at all church entrances, as a place to jot down and remember the **one thing** to hold in your heart and mind all week. If you forget the booklet at home please feel free to take another one. Use the one word or thought during the week as the Holy Spirit moves you.

# Why the Ancient Traditions of Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving during Lent?

"Even now, says the Lord, return to me with your whole heart .."



In preparation for the great celebration of Easter, we are called to pray, fast and give alms to the poor as some of the ways that will help us draw closer to God during Lent.

<u>Prayer</u> is one of the main ways to connect with God , in silence, in words, and in worship. Jesus prayed constantly and taught us to pray to Our Father in heaven. Jesus emphasized that our prayer need not be long, complicated or showy, but rather, short, to the point, and heartfelt. You might want to consider joining us for weekday Mass in the church during Lent.

<u>Fasting</u> on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, (taking only one full meal) reminds us of our dependence on God ..we "do not live on bread alone." On the Fridays of Lent we remember the sacrifice of Christ on Good Friday and unite ourselves with that sacrifice through abstinence from meat. These are acts of self-discipline and self-control which can help to keep us mindful of God's loving presence.

Almsgiving; Lent invites us to see the face of Christ in the hungry and homeless, sick and suffering. Jesus depends on us to listen with compassion to the joys and sorrows of our friends and family members and to reach out in kindness and compassion to all. #### A Story of Thanksgiving

The guests at the Mustard are hungry. Dinner is usually eaten quickly. More than 175 plates of food are served and the dining room is mostly empty within 15 or 20 minutes. There often seems to be a latecomer who arrives at the door and is surprised that the meal is over. "Is there anything left to eat?" the disappointed guest asks. Someone says, "There is left over bread- we can make you a peanut butter sandwich and how about a cup of milk?". "Thanks, that would be great!" The latecomer sits and waits guietly. "What's your name" someone asks and introductions begin. "Where will you sleep tonight?" A latecomer recently answered, "On an open porch- the owner said I could stay there." The conversation continues in short cautious sentences, neither of us wanting to make the other uncomfortable. "It's pretty cold out tonight, could you use a blanket?" "Sure, that would be great." the stranger answers. We find a blanket, hat, scarf and gloves. "Wow! Thanks! God bless you" says the guest as he finishes his sandwich. "I really appreciate all of this" he adds as he leaves.

I am so thankful that there are moments like this onewhen the rush of the crowd and big meal is over and there is this quiet, gentle time with a latecomer who has left a little less hungry and cold. I am so grateful to all of you who make these moments happen through your generosity of food, clothing and prayers.

#### THE FAMILY CONNECTION

Spiritual Rituals - This can be a regular devotional time in your home with an established format such as a Bible reading and a prayer or family petitions. It can also be less formal, taking cues from the calendar and using liturgical seasons, or even someone's birthday as a jumping off point for prayer. You might establish a daily quiet time. For younger families you might establish a daily quiet time, when kids are encouraged to just lie on their beds and discuss their problems and feelings with God. Whatever your preference, make family prayer a habit. Rituals give children a sense of security and happiness.
