



#### **Lenten Regulations**

Lenten fast and abstinence regulations form the Diocese of Worcester are as follows:

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics fourteen (14) and older on Good Friday and all Fridays of Lent.

Fasting is to be observed by all Catholics 18 years of age but not yet 59 years of age on Good Friday.

Those who are bound to fast may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's need, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed Lenten penitential practices.

## Why the Ancient Traditions of Prayer, Fasting & Almsgiving during Lent?

In preparation for the great celebration of Easter, we are called to pray, fast and give alms as some of the ways to help us draw closer to God during Lent.

<u>Prayer</u> is one of the ways to connect with God , in silence, in words, and in worship. Jesus prayed constantly and taught us to pray to Our Father in heaven. Jesus emphasized that our prayer need not be long, complicated or showy, but rather, short, to the point, and heartfelt.

<u>Fasting</u> on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, (taking only one full meal) reminds us of our dependence on God. We "do not live on bread alone."

On the Fridays of Lent we remember the sacrifice of Christ on Good Friday and unite ourselves with that sacrifice through abstinence from meat. These are acts of self-discipline and self-control which can help to keep us mindful of God's loving presence.

Almsgiving; Lent invites us to see the face of Christ in the hungry and homeless, sick and suffering. Jesus depends on us to listen with compassion to the joys and sorrows of our friends and family members and to reach out in kindness and compassion to all. #### From Father Nally: Take Action! Say No To Roe!!

A public hearing for the "Roe" bills ( to Remove Obstacles and Expand abortion access) took place 6/17/2019 in the MA State House. The proposed legislation (Senate Bill 1209/House Bill 3320) is designed to dramatically expand abortion at the state level with virtually no limits – just like New York.

If "ROE" becomes law:

- Abortion will be allowed through all nine months of pregnancy.
- A girl of any age will be able to get an abortion without her parents' knowledge
- Babies who survive late term abortion attempts can be left to die after birth
- Late term abortions will no longer have to be performed in hospitals
