


### From Your Pastor

Once again, I am extending an invitation to the young men of our parishes who are in high school or older to consider a vocation to the priesthood. As a priest for almost 44 years, I know that I would not have considered this calling if it were not for the example of priesthood that I saw lived out faithfully and prayerfully by the priests in my home parish. I certainly witnessed in these priests an excellent example of what was meant by giving of oneself totally to God. Their giftedness and self-sacrifice were certainly a great inspiration for me. For any young man who has ever considered the priesthood, please feel free to speak with me or Fr. Charles. I might also mention that our diocese annually sponsors a retreat, led by Bishop McManus, for young men to discern or prayerfully consider if the priesthood is for them. This year's retreat is scheduled for the weekend of March 23/24, from 6:00 P.M Friday to 6:00 P.M. Saturday at Immaculate Conception Retreat Center in Putnam, CT. ### Lenten Regulations





Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics fourteen (14) and older on Good Friday and all Fridays of Lent.

Fasting is to be observed by all Catholics 18 years of age but not yet 59 years of age on Good Friday.

Those who are bound to fast may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's need, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed Lenten penitential practices.

# Why the Ancient Traditions of Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving during Lent?

"Even now, says the Lord, return to me with your whole heart .."



In preparation for the great celebration of Easter, we are called to pray, fast and give alms to the poor as some of the ways that will help us draw closer to God during Lent.

<u>Prayer</u> is one of the main ways to connect with God , in silence, in words, and in worship. Jesus prayed constantly and taught us to pray to Our Father in heaven. Jesus emphasized that our prayer need not be long, complicated or showy, but rather, short, to the point, and heartfelt. You might want to consider joining us for weekday Mass in the church during

<u>Fasting</u> on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, (taking only one full meal) reminds us of our dependence on God ..we "do not live on bread alone." On the Fridays of Lent we remember the sacrifice of Christ on Good Friday and unite ourselves with that sacrifice through abstinence from meat. These are acts of self-discipline and self-control which can help to keep us mindful of God's loving presence.

Almsgiving; Lent invites us to see the face of Christ in the hungry and homeless, sick and suffering. Jesus depends on us to listen with compassion to the joys and sorrows of our friends and family members and to reach out in kindness and compassion to all. # Start a New Practice this Lent! An Invitation To Hear "One Thing" at Mass

Our lives can be filled with so much! Yet God is present and speaks to us always, especially at Mass. We hear it

sometimes, but the clutter of life can cause us to miss it or forget. As a parish community we are invited to try something new at Mass. Listen to the music, readings, preaching, prayers and to the silence in your own heart. Ask God to help you hear just one word or idea, one challenge or invitation, that will help you to grow spiritually during the coming week. Use the little booklet, which you will find at all church entrances, as a place to jot down and remember the **one thing** to hold in your heart and mind all week.

### Here's what happened when I tried it:

I sat at Mass a few minutes and then glanced down at the directions on the back of the "Mass Notes". "...Listen to the music, readings, preaching, prayers and to the silence in your own heart. Ask God to help you hear just one word or idea, one challenge or invitation, that will help you to grow spiritually during the coming week."

The busy buzz of the day was in my head so it took a minute for me to settle into Mass. After a while I listened and heard the words "transfigure us". They stood out and stuck in my mind. I thought, "maybe this is what God wants me to hear?". I jotted it down in my "Mass Notes". Later on at Mass I heard "Christ in me arise". I already had my "one thing" so I ignored this second phrase for a while. Yet it kept repeating in my mind so I finally jotted it down too. I forgot it all for a few days until I found the "Mass Notes" in my Sunday coat.

I sat quietly a while and paid attention to the phrases I had written there. Maybe they meant the same thing? I looked up the word "transfigure" online to see how it might fit into my current life situation. I waited and prayed a bit. I noticed that the words I had written were actually "transfigure us"! It dawned on me that this tapped into my deep desire to be part of the transformation- the dramatic change - for all of us together - to be transfigured as a parish community. For the last 16 years I have been a part of promoting and traveling the journey of our development as a parish. It has been a privilege, a challenge and a great joy for me. At this point I am growing older, passing the typical age of retirement! I find I am asking myself, "what is most important to me now?". I have no answer yet but I look forward to reflecting on it further. Lastly I still found myself humming "Christ in me arise". I notice I feel honored to think that Christ is in me! I am glad I didn't ignore those words. It's turned into a repeating prayer in my head all week; "Christ in me arise". So goes my reflection on these "Mass Notes" so far. I look forward to where God will lead me next . This beginning has been surprising, intriguing and uplifting. Looking forward to Mass next Sunday. Ann Dovle
