

## From Your Pastor


As we begin this Fourth Week of Lent, let us heed the words of our Holy Father, Pope Francis, which reflect upon the Gospel from St. John,

"I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life." (John 8:12)

#### **Lenten Regulations**

Lenten fast and abstinence regulations form the Diocese of Worcester are as follows:

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics fourteen (14) and older on Good Friday and all Fridays of Lent.

Fasting is to be observed by all Catholics 18 years of age but not yet 59 years of age on Good Friday.

Those who are bound to fast may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's need, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed Lenten penitential practices.

# Why the Ancient Traditions of Prayer, Fasting & Almsgiving during Lent?

In preparation for the great celebration of Easter, we are called to pray, fast and give alms as some of the ways to help us draw closer to God during Lent.

<u>Prayer</u> is one of the ways to connect with God , in silence, in words, and in worship. Jesus prayed constantly and taught us to pray to Our Father in heaven. Jesus emphasized that our prayer need not be long, complicated or showy, but rather, short, to the point, and heartfelt.

<u>Fasting</u> on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, (taking only one full meal) reminds us of our dependence on God. We "do not live on bread alone."

On the Fridays of Lent we remember the sacrifice of Christ on Good Friday and unite ourselves with that sacrifice through abstinence from meat. These are acts of self-discipline and self-control which can help to keep us mindful of God's loving presence.

Almsgiving; Lent invites us to see the face of Christ in the hungry and homeless, sick and suffering. Jesus depends on us to listen with compassion to the joys and sorrows of our friends and family members and to reach out in kindness and compassion to all. #### From Father Nally:

40 Days for Life is a prayer campaign that runs twice a year, once during Lent and once in the Fall, in hundreds of cities around the country and around the world.

40 DFL consists of 40 days of prayer and fasting, peaceful vigil outside abortion facilities, and community outreach, calling on God's help to end the scourge of abortion. Since 40 DFL started nationally in 2008, 16,742 babies have been saved, 106 abortion facilities have closed, and 196 abortion workers have left the industry. Our goal for our local campaign is to have people standing vigil and praying from 7am-7pm in front of the Planned Parenthood (470 Pleasant St.) in Worcester where 45 babies each week—babies up to 21 weeks gestation! are losing their lives. Since we have started praying at that location in 2010, 22,330 babies have been killed on Pleasant Street. (And that number doesn't include the 2019 abortions; that data won't be released until May.)
