

From Your Pastor

When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head not with the burial cloths, but rolled up in a separate place.



John 20:6-7

This scripture passage from today's Gospel for Easter Sunday shows us how overwhelmed the Apostles Peter and John were when they had heard the news that Jesus' body was not in the tomb where he had been buried just three days before. They did not know what to make of this event. Were they witnessing what Jesus had told them all along or was this some kind of prank? We know better, but do we really appreciate what has occurred here? Jesus triumphed over death but did not do this for himself alone. He is our savior! This means that we are heirs with him as St. Paul put it (Romans 6:4-8). He said that if we are heirs with him, then we will be glorified with him (Romans 8:17). This means that our bodies will be changed like his into glorious bodies. If we wish to remain faithful to this biblical testimony, then we must not think of resurrection as individuals but as people who share in this promise as a community, the work of God's creation. During this Easter season, let us dwell on this truth of our Catholic Christian faith and proclaim its message in our actions as well as in our words.

On behalf of our Parish Staff, I extend to all of you God's Blessings, manifested in our risen Lord, Jesus Christ. in this Easter Season!

I Love You

A couple of my brothers took a trip to New York with the grade school their kids attend and walked the city to see some of the sights. The one brother called out to our 5-year-old nephew, "Aidan, I love you." No response. He said it louder and again, nothing. On the third attempt, the quick-witted nephew answered in his most matter-of-fact tone, "I heard ya!" That ended his uncle's teasing in a hurry!

I love you. Three little words that many of us rarely say; we just assume that our family and friends know what we think and how we feel about them, so we skip saying it. Yet people often need to hear it, not so much because they don't know, but because they appreciate the thought and the reassurance. It takes no effort on our part, and it offers so much to those we love.

The other side effect of not saying 'I love you' is that we stop believing we are loveable, even by God. Assuming something that is never affirmed can lead to doubt, uncertainty and rejection. If we don't hear it, we can wonder if we are making it up, or if we believe something because we want to, not because it's true. So today, right now, let your family know that you love them. Don't show it, say it. Make sure they heard ya!

Bishop's Letter Easter 2019



My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

"He is not here; He has been raised!" The angel's Easter greeting echoes down through the centuries to bring hope, joy and courage to us all.

The Resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead is the single most significant event in the history of the world. It carries momentous meaning for each of our lives. For every widow who has wept at a grave, for every parent who has mourned a child and for all who grieve, their tears, mourning and grief will end. For all who have suffered injustice, betrayal or abandonment, Christ's triumph over sin, death and evil is cause for hope, inspiration to persevere, and reason to go on. Christ's Resurrection was not just for His own glory. It was for all of His followers that they might share in His glory not for a day or a season, but forever.

What we celebrate today is the reason we can always live for tomorrow. Whether we are 8, 18 or 88, it is literally true that our best days are ahead.
