

From Your Pastor

One thing in the life of Jesus that is most noteworthy is his recourse to prayer. In today's Gospel Jesus lifts his eyes to heaven and prays in the midst of uncertainty and fear that surrounded his Last Supper. Jesus not only prays for himself but for his disciples, knowing their weaknesses and how his forthcoming death will challenge them. He prays knowing that they will need protection, encouragement and strength if they are to go out into the world as active missionaries. Joining our prayer to that of Jesus lies at the heart of our second reading from the First Letter of St. John. When we acknowledge Jesus as the Son of God, God is there within us. Sometimes our formal prayers or the liturgical or communal prayers help us to articulate that love and need. At other times we may rely on what pours forth from our hearts even if it seems disjointed and inarticulate. Whenever we bring our praises and needs to God, it is an act of love. In our times of prayer may our love be the guide for our actions and shine forth in everything that we do.

I remind you that on Saturday, May 29th, at 10:00 A.M. Thiago Ibiapina (our seminarian from last summer) will be ordained to the Diaconate at St. Paul's Cathedral. He will be assisting and preaching at his Masses of Thanksgiving as a Deacon here at St. George's on Saturday, May 29th, at 7:00 P.M. to a Brazilian community (in Portuguese) and on Sunday, May 30th, at 1:30 P.M. (in English). Receptions will follow both Masses. Since no one from his family in his native Brazil will be able to attend his Diaconate Ordination and Mass of Thanksgiving, I hope that you - his parish family - will plan on attending one of the Masses of Thanksgiving.

Also, on May 29th but at 2:00 P.M., our seminarian for this summer, Julio Granados, will be ordained to the Diaconate at St. Paul's Cathedral. He will be assisting and preaching at a Mass of Thanksgiving at his home parish, St. John Paul II Parish in Southbridge.

Since I will be attending both Diaconate ordinations that day, there will be NO confessions on Saturday, May 29th.

<u>Sunday Afternoon Mass Proposal:</u> Due to a low return of forms for liturgical ministers for a late Sunday afternoon Mass, this proposal will be put on hold for now.

Homeless folks in Worcester are Currently in need of White Tube Socks

According to our local health clinic for the homeless many homeless folks walk at least 10 miles every day. This is a difficult way of life that often causes painful foot care issues. Most shelters or churches serve only one meal a day so walking from place to place is necessary.

The pandemic has closed several public buildings so folks must walk across the city in search of toilets and sources of clean drinking water. A few of the once available showers for the homeless are just now beginning to reopen. Folks also walk in search of "day labor" jobs and second hand clothing shops. Some carry their belongings from place to place or hide them in secluded area but then they must walk back to those hiding areas to be sure their items are safe from the weather or from being discarded or stolen.

Your donations of white tube socks can help. Please leave them in the Outreach Collection area at St. George Church labeled attention Annie Doyle and they will be brought to folks most in need.






