

Grandfather clocks contain an amazing assortment of wheels, gadgets and weights that keep perfect time and announce the hours in solemn tones. So when the clock in our home needed attention, we called an expert that could fine-tune those small parts to run precisely. He spread a felt cloth on the table and laid out all the screwdrivers, wrenches and the flashlight he would need to get the job done. He called them the tools of the trade. They were worn with age and use, and fit his hands perfectly, as though they were made just for that purpose.

Faith has its own tools of the trade and they come to us through the Holy Spirit. We call them Gifts and Fruits, but they are the means by which God's grace and wisdom are shared with us so that we live a life of faith. Like any tools, however, they only get better with use. The more we practice them, the more familiar they become to us, becoming a part of who we are and how we live.

When things at home are not running the way they should be, it is time for everyone to fine-tune your relationship. Practicing the gifts of the Holy Spirit will alleviate stress, create dialogue, enhance tranquility and offer security for each member. The tools of the trade of faith can work in ways that are obvious yet mysterious because they are expressions of grace in our hands. Use them wisely, often and generously. They'll soon fit your family as though they were made for that purpose—which, of course, they were!


