

Confirmation Service Experience



The Body and Blood of Christ

After dinner at our parents' home on Christmas Day, we were sitting at the table, reminiscing about the Christmas celebrations of our childhood. The middle brother picked up one of my mother's incredible cookies and held it up as he announced that this was the best memory of his childhood Christmas. He told the story of being ten years old and sneaking to the kitchen in the middle of the night, just to get a Christmas cookie. A second later, the cookie was gone and it became another part of his memories!

Our celebration of the Body and Blood of Christ is more that just remembering the past. Through the sacrament, the sacrifice of Jesus is made present again under the forms of bread and wine. We do not simply recall the Pascal Mystery; we are present to it and participate in it. We are joined with all those who believe—past, present and future—to offer the one perfect sacrifice of Jesus. Food Pantry Needs continue


Peanut Butter, Tuna and boxes of cold cereal are a special need. This time of year, children's sunscreen is an important item as well.
