

From Your Pastor

From the Pastor's Desk:
From Your Pastor (with the assistance of an article from Ministry & Liturgy magazine for November, 2005)

At this time of the year, I like to mention a topic that I have presented to you in the past. It has to do with a process that is very important in the life of the Church – the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults or RCIA as it more commonly known. This process is available to adults who have never been baptized or to those who have been baptized but were never instructed or catechized after baptism. There are several stages of preparation in this process that help a person become a full-fledged member of the Catholic Church.

One begins with the precatechumenate where (s)he has some spiritual conversation about God and the Church. Then the rite of acceptance into the order of catechumens is celebrated where the person is considered a member of the Church in a broad sense. During this time one becomes familiar with what the Church teaches, follows the Christian way of life and engages in liturgical prayer. This formation period concludes with the rite of election when the Church, in the name of the local bishop calls the catechumen to the eventual reception of the sacraments of initiation – Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. This rite of election takes place on the First Sunday of Lent.

During the Lenten season, one continues in a period purification and enlightenment in order to spiritually prepare to celebrate the sacraments of initiation. During the Easter Vigil the person receives the sacraments of initiation. After receiving these sacraments one enters into a period called mystagogy that usually coincides with the 50 days of the Easter season. This time is one of deepening the new Catholic Christian's participation in their new faith community of the Church by meditating, praying, worshipping and doing works of charity. This period of mystagogy prepares the person for a lifelong relationship in his/her new faith life and emphasizes the importance of remaining close to the faith community of the Church to which (s)he now belongs.

We call the area hospitals each week to see if any of our parishioners are hospitalized. Thank you for your understanding.





- sweaters


And as always, Non-perishable food items are always needed, especially breakfast cereal.
